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1. Hybrid Mode.

CRL.M.A. 5175/2026 & CRL.M.A. 5182/2026 (release of passport)

CRL.M.A. 5181/2026 & CRL.M.A. 5176/2026 (permission to travel abroad)

2. The present applications have been filed by the appellant/applicant under section 482 Cr.P.C r/w section 528 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, seeking permission to travel to the United Kingdom from 16.05.2026 to 22.05.2026, and to the United States of America from 22.05.2026 to 17.08.2026. The applicant also seeks the release of her passport.

3. Mr. Pramod Kumar Dubey, the learned Senior Counsel appearing on behalf of the appellant/applicant submits that son and daughter of the appellant/applicant are residing in Los Angeles, USA and the brother-in-law in Camberley, England, UK. He submits that the appellant/applicant intends to spend time with them, celebrate her son's 50th Birthday as well as celebrate her own birthday, with them.

4. Pursuant to the notice issued, Respondent-CBI filed reply / status report raising the objection / apprehension that the applicant may misuse the liberty and flee from justice.

5. With regard to the permission to travel abroad, in the Status Report, it is submitted that the itinerary submitted by the applicant for travelling from Delhi to London, then from London to Los Angeles and subsequently the



return journey, has been verified from the website of the airline and has been found to be genuine.

6. The learned Senior Counsel submits that the applicant has previously been granted permission to travel abroad on multiple occasions and has complied with all conditions imposed on her. There was never ever any instance of misuse of any nature. To facilitate her travel abroad on earlier occasions, the passport was released to the applicant, which was re-deposited with the Registrar General of this Court, in time on every occasion.

7. Learned counsel for the Appellant brings to the notice of this Court the fact that the applicant has been permitted to travel abroad about twelve times in the past, including for extended durations exceeding three months, which permissions she has never misused and has returned to India on time after meeting with her family.

8. Keeping in view the fact that the appellant/applicant has been granted similar permissions to travel abroad on not less than twelve times and she has always returned within the time period granted to her, the present applications moved on behalf of the appellant/applicant *qua* release of her passport and travel are, therefore, allowed, taking into account the entire gamut of facts and circumstances.

9. Accordingly, the appellant/applicant is granted permission to travel abroad from 16.05.2026 to 22.05.2026 (UK) and from 22.05.2026 to 17.08.2026 (USA), as per the itinerary and particulars furnished in these applications, upon her complying with the following conditions;

- i. That the appellant/applicant shall furnish her address where she would stay during the visit abroad;



- ii. That the appellant/applicant shall furnish the security in the sum of Rs. 5,00,000/- in the form of an FDR to be deposited with the Registrar General of this Court;
 - iii. That the appellant/applicant shall also file the affidavit to the effect that she shall not oppose in any manner the proceedings to be carried out in her absence and she shall be represented through her counsel;
 - iv. That the appellant/applicant shall inform to the court about her return to Indian within 3 days of her return and shall deposit her passport to the Registrar General of this Court within the aforesaid 3 days;
 - v. That the appellant/applicant shall also intimate in writing to the Investigating Officer about the date when she wants to leave abroad and the date she will return back;
 - vi. That the appellant/applicant will adhere to her schedule and would not extend her stay.
10. The Registrar General is directed to release the appellant's passport, for the limited purpose of travelling abroad, as permitted above.
11. In view of the above, the present applications stand disposed of.
