Heard Mr. N.K. Sarma, learned counsel for the applicant. Also heard Ms. M. Bhattacharjee, learned Addl. Senior Government Advocate for the opposite party Nos. 1 and 2; and Mr. C. Baruah, learned standing counsel for the opposite party Nos. 3, 4 and 5.

Mr. Baruah, learned standing counsel for the opposite party Nos. 3, 4 and 5 has produced one letter dated 08.07.2025, written by the Senior Accounts Officer, Legal Cell, and on the basis of the same, Mr. Baruah submits that fresh PPO has already been issued to the petitioner fixing the monthly basic pension at Rs. 40,750/-. Mr. Baruah also submits that now there is no recovery to be made from the pensionary benefits, instead the petitioner will get additional amount of Rs. 1,50,000/-, i.e. the difference between his admissible DCRG and the provisional DCRG, which was paid by the Department earlier.

In view of the submission of Mr. Baruah, learned standing counsel for the opposite party Nos. 3, 4 and 5, Mr. Sarma, learned counsel for the applicant is directed to obtain instruction from the petitioner.

List the matter on 07.01.2026.

Till then, interim order passed earlier shall continue.
