Petition Under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue an order or direction or writ, more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus, declare the impugned action of the respondents in not releasing and paying the General Provident Fund amount of Rs.28,16,901/- with Token No. 2522923290, dt. 21.9.2024 is illegal, arbitrary, unfair, unjust, discrimination, apart from violation of all the Statutory Rules and Constitutional provisions and consequently direct the respondents to release and pay the General Provident Fund amount of Rs. 28,16,901/- with Token No. 2522923290, dt. 21.9.2024, with interest @ 24percentage per annum from date of retirement to till the date of actual payment is made.

**WRIT PETITION No.326 OF 2025**

**ORDER:**

With the consent of both the parties, this Writ Petition is taken up for disposal, at the admission stage.

2. This Writ Petition, under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, is filed seeking to declare the action of the respondents in not releasing and paying GPF amount of Rs.28,16,901/- with Token No.2522923290, dated 21.09.2024, as illegal and arbitrary and consequently, direct the respondents to release the said GPF amount with interest @ 24% per annum from the date of retirement till the date of actual payment is made.

3. Heard Sri P.Ugender Reddy, learned counsel for the petitioner; learned Government Pleader for Services-III for respondent Nos.1 to 4; and learned Government Pleader for Services-I for respondent No.5.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner retired from services in the capacity of Lecturer

(Physics) on 31.05.2024 on attaining the age of superannuation. Thereafter, the petitioner has submitted his pension proposals to the respondents for sanction of pension. Consequently, the pension proposals were processed by the Competent Authority and the same were sent to O/o. Principal Accountant General, Telangana, who inturn verified and accorded sanction *vide* letter, dated 05.09.2024. Subsequently, the concerned Officers cleared the same and issued token numbers. However, even after lapse of seven months from the date of retirement, GPF amount was not released so far. Therefore, learned counsel prays this Court to direct the respondents to release GPF amount to the petitioner pursuant to letter, dated 05.09.2024, issued by the Principal Accountant General, Telangana.

5. Learned Government Pleader for the respondents submits that in pursuance of letter, dated 05.09.2024, the respondents will release the GPF amount to the petitioner. However, prays this Court to grant twelve weeks time in this regard.

6. Having regard to the submissions made by learned counsel for the respective parties, this Writ Petition is disposed of directing the respondents to release GPF amount to the petitioner in pursuance of Letter No.AG (A&E)TS/F211/II/2024-2025/731, dated 05.09.2024, issued by the Principal Accountant General, Telangana, as expeditiously as possible, preferably within a period of eight (8) weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order. There shall be no order as to costs.

Miscellaneous petitions pending, if any, shall stand closed.

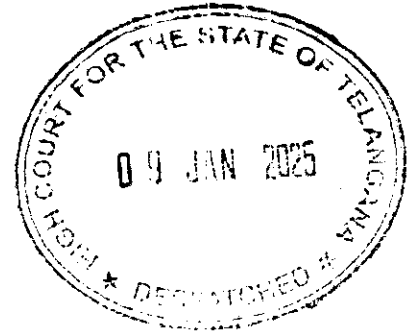
