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COMMON ORDER

Since the parties and crime involved in these two cases are common, they are being heard together and disposed of by way of this common order.

2. These two Criminal Petitions are filed under Section 482 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (for short 'BNSS') for grant of pre-arrest bail to the petitioners, who are arrayed as accused Nos.3 and 2 in Crime No.47 of 2026 before the Goshamahal Police Station, Hyderabad, registered for the offences punishable under Sections 318 (4), 316(5), 351(2) read with 3(5) of the BNS.

3. Heard Mr.Mohd.Fasiuddin, learned counsel for the petitioners-A.2 and A.3 and Sri M.Ramachandra Reddy, learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing for the respondent-State.

4. The case of the prosecution is that the *de facto* complainant lodged a report before police on 13.06.2026, wherein it is stated that the complainant used deal in gold business. The accused persons are also running a jewellery business under the name and style of 'Masood jewellers' situated at Gulazar House, Hyderabad, over a period of time. It is stated that the accused developed acquaintance with complainant by frequently visiting his place of business and projecting themselves as reputed and well-established jewelers in the Gulzar House thereby gaining his confidence. It is stated that the accused persons has gold transactions with the complainant earlier and paid good profits 2-3 times to gain his confidence and after gaining his confidence, the accused approached him on 11.08.2024 at his business place and induced him to give 101 grams of pure gold for their urgent business requirement assuring that they would seel the same in their shop and pay 8% of the total gold value as commission everyday in cash i.e., Rs.2500/- per day for 30 days , in case of

failure, they would return the gold. Thereafter, the accused persons paid the commission for few days and thereafter stopped in payment and cheated the complainant. Hence, he requested the police to take necessary action against the accused persons. Basing on the same, police registered a case for the aforesaid offences.

5. Learned counsel for the petitioners-A.3 and A.2 would submit that the petitioners are innocent of the offences alleged against them; that even according to the complainant, he received commission and good profits 2-3 times from the petitioners; that material part of the investigation is already completed; that other accused arrested and released on bail and hence, he prays to grant Anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

6. On the other hand, learned Additional Public Prosecutor opposed the same and submits that the allegations levelled against the petitioners are serious in nature; that it involves huge amount of gold which has to be recovered from the possession of the accused and therefore, at this stage, the petitioners are not entitled for grant of bail and hence, he prays to dismiss the bail.

7. Having regard to the submissions by the parties and on perusal of the material placed on record, the allegation

against the petitioners is that they are sureties to the for the said transactions and as material part of the investigation is completed, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioners subject to the following conditions:

- (i) The petitioners-A.3 and A.2 shall surrender before the Station House Officer, Goshamahal Police Station, Hyderabad, within two (2) weeks from today, and on such surrender, the petitioners shall be released on bail on executing a personal bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only)each with two sureties for a like sum each.
- (ii) On such release the petitioners shall appear before the concerned Investigating Officer on every Wednesday between 09:00 a.m, and 05:00 p.m., for a period of eight (8) weeks or till the filing of the charge sheet, whichever is earlier, and thereafter, as and when required.
- (iii) The petitioners shall abide by the other conditions stipulated in Section 482(2) of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 and co-operate with the Investigating Officer in investigating the case.

8. Accordingly, these two Criminal Petitions are allowed.

Miscellaneous applications, if any pending, shall stand closed.
