Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue an order or direction more particularly one in the nature of writ of mandamus or any other appropriate writ declaring the action of the respondent authorities in not passing any orders, considering the representation of the petitioner dated 17-03-2026

permitting him to deliver the balance stocks of rice 24 ACKs (6960 Quintals) of rice which is to be delivered by the petitioner by way of FRK Sannabiyyam by granting sufficient time as granted through Memos dated 24-11-2025, and not paying the milling charges, driage 1%, transportation and go down charges payable to the petitioner rice mill from 2022-23, is nothing but arbitrary, illegal, null and void and violative of principles of natural justice and also violative of Articles 14, 19 and 21 of the Constitution of India. Consequently, direct the respondent authorities to consider the representation dated 17-03-2026, permitting the petitioner to deliver the balance rice to be delivered by his rice mill as stated above and to pay the milling charges, driage 1 % transportation and godown charges payable to the petitioner.

Petition under Section 151 CPC praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to direct the respondent authorities not to take any coercive steps against the petitioner for the non delivery of the balance rice to be delivered by his rice mill.

Pleader for Civil Supplies, appearing on behalf of respondent
Nos.1 and 4 to 6 and Sri K. Devender, learned Standing
Counsel for Telangana State Civil Supplies Corporation Ltd.,
appearing on behalf of respondent Nos.2 and 3.**

**2. The petitioner approached the Court seeking prayer as
under:**

"... to issue an order or direction more particularly one in
the nature of writ of mandamus or any other appropriate writ

declaring the action of the respondent authorities in not passing any orders, considering the representation of the petitioner dated 17.03.2026 permitting him to deliver the balance stocks of rice 24 ACKs (6960 Quintals) of rice which is to be delivered by the petitioner by way of FRK Sannabiyyam by granting sufficient time as granted through Memos dated 24.11.2025, and not paying the milling charges, driage 1%, transportation and godown charges payable to the petitioner rice mill from 2022-23, is nothing but arbitrary, illegal, null and void and violative of principles of natural justice and also violative of Articles 14, 19 and 21 of the Constitution of India Consequently direct the respondent authorities to consider the representation dated 17.03.2026, permitting the petitioner to deliver the balance rice to be delivered by his rice mill as stated above and to pay the milling charges, driage 1%, transportation and godown charges payable to the petitioner and to pass..."

3. The case of the petitioner in brief as per the averments made in the affidavit filed by the petitioner in support of the present Writ Petition is as under:-

i) The petitioner is the owner of rice mill by name M/s. SRR Industries, situated at Engal Village, Chendurthi Mandal, Rajanna Sircilla District. The respondent authorities allotted Grade-A paddy to the petitioner and during Kharif 2024-25 season, a total quantity of 14,765 quintals of paddy was allotted. Out of the said quantity, 24 ACKs of rice (equivalent to 6960 quintals) could not be delivered by the petitioner.

ii) The respondents authorities issued Memo No.2809/CS.I-CCS/2025, dated 24.11.2025 wherein 90 days time was given for delivery of FRK Sannabiyam. The respondent authorities issued another Memo CCS.Ref.No.PI (1)/1650/2025, dated 24.11.2025 regarding dues pertaining to KMS 2024-25 (Rabi Crops).

iii) In compliance, the petitioner had submitted a representation to the 4th respondent on 17.03.2026, seeking time to deliver the balance stock of rice, but no action was taken. Aggrieved by the same, the petitioner approached this Court by filing the present writ petition.

DISCUSSION AND CONCLUSION:

4. It is represented by the learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner that the subject issue in the present writ petition is squarely covered by the order of this Court dated 17.03.2026 passed in W.P.No.8105 of 2026 and hence, the petitioner herein is entitled for the similar relief as extended to the petitioner in W.P.No.8105 of 2026.

5. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner also brings on record Memo.677/CS.I-CCS/2026 dated 25.03.2026, issued by the E.O.Principal Secretary to Government, Government of Telangana, Consumer Affairs, Food and Civil Supplies (CS.I.CCS)

Department and contends that orders have been issued *vide* memo dated 24.11.2025 and the same have been further extended for a further period of three (03) months so as to enable the defaulter rice millers to deliver FRK Sannabiyyam or Cash to the value of defaulted quantity @ 125% including penalty and 12% interest, and therefore, the petitioner is entitled for the relief as prayed for by the petitioner, in the present writ petition.

6. Learned Assistant Government Pleader for Civil Supplies, appearing on behalf of respondent Nos.1 and 4 to 6 and Sri K. Devender, learned Standing Counsel for Telangana State Civil Supplies Corporation Ltd., appearing on behalf of respondent Nos.2 and 3, do not dispute the said submissions made by the learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner and the issuance of Memo No.677/CS.I-CCS/2026, dated 25.03.2026 issued by the E.O.Principal Secretary to Government, Government of Telangana.

7. **Taking into consideration :**

- a) **The aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case,**
- b) **The submissions made by the learned Assistant Government Pleader for Civil Supplies, appearing on behalf of respondent Nos.1 and 4 to 6 and Sri K. Devender, learned**

Standing Counsel for Telangana State Civil Supplies Corporation Ltd., appearing on behalf of respondent Nos.2 and 3,

c) The contents of the petitioner's representation dated 17.03.2026 which has been addressed to the respondent No.4 herein, which had even been acknowledged by the Office of the respondent No.4 but however, no orders had been passed as on date,

d) The discussion and conclusion as arrived at paragraph Nos.4 to 6 of the present order,

e) The Memo dated 25.03.2026 issued by the E.O.Principal Secretary to Government, Government of Telangana, Consumer Affairs, Food and Civil Supplies (CS.I.CCS) Department, extending a further period of three (03) months to enable the defaulter rice millers to deliver FRK Sannabiyyam or Cash to the value of the defaulted quantity.

The writ petition is disposed of, directing the Respondent No.4 - District Collector, Rajanna Sircilla District to consider the grievance of the petitioner as put forth by the

petitioner vide petitioner's representation dated 17.03.2026, addressed to the Respondent No.4, seeking grant of further time to deliver 24 ACKs of rice and complete the CMR (Custom Milled Rice) delivery, within a period of two (02) weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, in accordance to law, by duly considering the Memo dated 25.03.2026 issued by respondent No.1 herein in favour of the defaulter rice millers and pass appropriate orders on the representation of the petitioner dated 17.03.2026 and duly communicate the decision on the said representation to the petitioner herein. There shall be no order as to costs.

Miscellaneous petitions, if any, pending in this Writ Petition, shall stand closed.

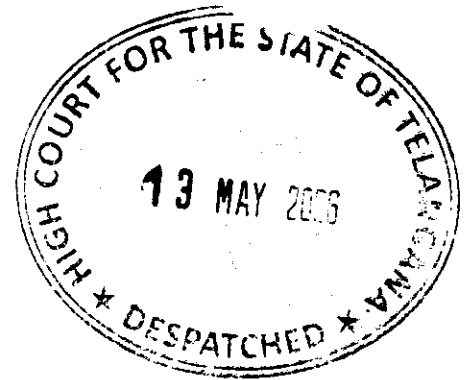
