ORDER

This Criminal Petition has been filed seeking to quash the proceedings in C.C.No.221 of 2025, on the file of the Junior Civil Judge-cum-Judicial Magistrate of First Class, Luxettipet, against petitioner/accused No.1 for the offences under Section 420 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860.

2. Heard Mr. Bejjaram Ravi Chandra, learned counsel representing Mr. K. Pavan Kalyan, learned counsel for the petitioner and Mr. Jithender Rao Veeramalla, learned Additional Public Prosecutor for respondent No.1.

3. Though the criminal petition was filed seeking to quash the proceedings in C.C.No.221 of 2025, when this Court expressed a view that all the grounds which are raised by the petitioner are disputed facts and the same have to be decided by the trial Court after full-fledged trial. At this stage, the learned counsel for the petitioner after arguing at length, requested this Court to dispense with the appearance of the petitioner/accused No.1 in C.C.No.221 of 2025, on the file of the Junior Civil Judge-cum-Judicial Magistrate of First Class, Luxettipet, on the ground that the petitioner is a Government Teacher. Hence, it is very difficult for the petitioner to appear on each and every date of adjournment in the trial Court and the matter before the trial Court has not yet ripened for trial and is at the stage of examination. As such the learned counsel sought for dispensing with the presence of petitioner before the Trial Court.

4. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor has not opposed the submission made by the learned counsel for petitioner.

5. Taking into consideration the peculiar facts and circumstances of the case and also the submissions made by the

learned counsel for the petitioner, the presence of the petitioner/accused No.1 in C.C.No.221 of 2025, on the file of the Junior Civil Judge-cum-Judicial Magistrate of First Class, Luxettipet, is dispensed with, subject to the condition that the petitioner/accused No.1 shall be represented by his counsel on every date of hearing, unless his presence is specifically required during the course of the trial. In the event of non-appearance of petitioner/accused No.1 on any date so fixed by the trial Court, the trial Court shall be entitled to proceed with the matter in accordance with law.

6. Accordingly, the criminal petition is disposed of.

Pending miscellaneous applications, if any shall stand closed.

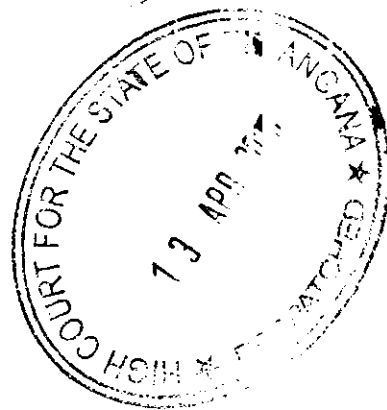
