Petition Under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to pass an order, direction or a writ particularly in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declaring that the action on part of the respondent no. 3 in closing the complaint of the petitioner dated 10.3.2026, through its email dated 30.3.2026, is highly illegal, arbitrary, without following due process of law and amounts to colorable exercise of powers and in violation of the provisions of Bhartiya Nagrik Suraksah Sanhita, 2023. ORDER:

The present Writ Petition is filed under Article 226 of
Constitution of India for the following relief/s:-

“... to pass an order, direction or a writ particularly in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declaring that the action on part of the respondent no.3 in closing the complaint of the petitioner dated 10.03.2026, through its email dated 30.03.2026 is highly illegal, arbitrary, without following due process of law and amounts to colorable exercise of powers and in violation of the provisions of Bhartiya Nagrik Suraksah Sanhita, 2023. Consequently, this Hon'ble Court may be pleased to direct the respondent No.3 to take necessary action on the complaint dated 10.03.2026 in accordance with law, in the interest of justice and pass.....”

2. Heard Mr.Mohammad Adnan, learned counsel for the petitioner and Mr.M.Srinivas, learned Assistant Government

Pleader for Home representing learned Government Pleader for Home appearing for respondents. Perused the record.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner would submit admittedly, the petitioner had addressed a criminal complaint, dated 10.03.2026 through email from United States of America, to respondent No.3 against respondent No.4. He would submit that without conducting any enquiry to ascertain whether the complaint discloses a cognizable or non-cognizable and stating that the petitioner neither appeared before respondent No.3 nor produced evidence to substantiate the allegations made in the complaint, respondent No.3, *vide* email, dated 13.03.2026 had closed the complaint, which completely caused injustice to the petitioner. Hence, he would seek to pass appropriate orders.

4. Learned Assistant Government Pleader for Home would submit that the procedure adopted by the respondent-police, contemplates that complaints received through email must, within three days, be substantiated by the complainant by producing physical evidence and personally appearing before the concerned authority along with such evidence. In the present case, since the petitioner has not appeared within a

period of three days, respondent No.3 has closed the complaint, after a lapse of 20 days. Hence, he would submit that nothing would persist to adjudicate the matter and seek to dismiss this writ petition.

5. This Court having heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned Assistant Government Pleader for Home and upon perusal of material placed in the writ petition, it is an admitted fact that email complaint filed by the petitioner on 10.03.2026 was closed through email communication to the petitioner herein on 13.03.2026. On careful examination, this Court is of the opinion that since the petitioner is willing to appear before respondent No.3 to substantiate his allegations made in the complaint, it is open for the petitioner to file a fresh complaint by appearing before respondent No.3 and in the event of his appearance before the said authority by filing a fresh complaint, the said authority shall examine the same and take appropriate action in accordance with law.

6. Accordingly, the Writ Petition is disposed of. No costs.

Miscellaneous Petitions, pending if any, shall stand closed.
