Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue any appropriate writ, order or directions more in the nature of Writ of Mandamus for declaring action on the part of the respondent No. 4 and 5 in not conducting fair investigation and not take proper steps to remand the unofficial respondents in cognizable offences viz offence punishable under section 109 read with section 3(5) of B.N.S. in pursuant to FIR 2193/2025 dated. 14/11/2025 is wholly illegal, highly arbitrary, unconstitutional, bad in law and against the provision of article 14, 15 and 21 of Constitution of India and Section 173 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023 (corresponding to old Section 154 of Cr.P.C.) and against the principles laid down in Lalitha Kumaris case and against the principles of natural justice and direct the respondent No.2 and 3 to transfer or entrust to senior and independent officer outside of Narisngi Police Station to

conduct fair and impartial investigation in pursuant to crime No. 2193/2025 and duly followed the procedure and guidelines of Supreme Court .

The petition coming on for hearing, upon perusing the petition and the affidavit filed in support thereof and upon hearing the arguments of SRI G DINESH PATIL Advocate for the Petitioner, ASST GP FOR HOME for the Respondent Nos. 1 to 5, the Court made the following.
