Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue writ order or direction more particularly one in the nature of WRIT OF MANDAMUS declaring the inaction of the respondents No 3 & 4 in disposing of the application dated. 11-12-2025 85 31-12-2025 to implement the orders passed on 15.11.2025 in Case No. G/2213/2025 under section 23 of the Maintenance and Welfare of parents and Senior Citizen Act 2007 according to the law is illegal, arbitrary and unconstitutional Consequently direct the respondents No 3 & 4 forthwith to implement the orders passed on 15.11.2025 in Case No. G/2213/2025 under section 23 of the Maintenance and Welfare of parents and Senior Citizen Act 2007.

Petition under Section 151 of C.P.C praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to direct the respondents No. 3 & 4 to implement the orders passed on 15.11.2025 in Case No. G/2213/2025 under section 23 of the Maintenance and Welfare of parents and Senior Citizen Act 2007, pending disposal of WP No 12310 of 2026, on the file of the High Court.

The petition coming on for hearing, upon perusing the petition and the grounds filed in support thereof and upon hearing the arguments of M/s. Gundlapalli V.S.S.Sruthi Advocate for the Petitioner, GP for REVENUE for respondent No. 1 to 3 and GP for HOME for respondent No.4, the Court made the following.

ORDER:

None appears for the respondents.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the respondent No.3/Revenue Divisional Officer had passed order on 15.11.2025 under the provisions of Maintenance and Welfare Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007 (for short 'Act') upon the petition filed by the petitioner under Sections 5 and 23 of the said Act whereby certain directions were given to respondent Nos.5 and 6. Learned counsel further submits that though the orders were passed, the same were not implemented.

This Court by order dated 21.04.2026 directed the petitioner to take out personal notice on respondent Nos.5 and 6 and on a perusal of the record, it is observed that the notice was served on the respondent Nos.5 and 6, and even inspite of service on notice on respondent Nos.5 and 6, there is no representation when the matter is taken up today.

Learned counsel further submits that inspite of the orders passed by the respondent No.3/R.D.O. on 15.11.2025, petitioner is unable to enter his own house and that he has also preferred an appeal on the order dated 15.11.2025 before the District Collector seeking enhancement of compensation and that the petitioner is now homeless and he is sleeping in the bus shelters.

Considering the submissions of the learned counsel for the petitioner, the respondent Nos.3 and 4 are directed to implement the order passed on 15.11.2025 directing the respondent Nos.5 and 6 to permit the petitioner to re-enter and stay peacefully in the premises mentioned i.e., H.No.6-185, Plot No.C/41, Raghavendra Nagar Colony, Jillelaguda Village, Balapur Mandal, Ranga Reddy District, immediately and respondent Nos.5 and 6 are directed to pay the arrears amount of as directed by the respondent No.3 and file the proof to that extent by the next date of hearing.

Registry is directed to communicate this order to the respondents, for its effective and immediate implementation.
