This Petition coming on for hearing, upon perusing the Memorandum of Grounds of Criminal Petition and upon hearing the arguments of Sri Syed Hassan Bin Taher, Advocate for the Petitioner and Sri M. Ramachandra Reddy, learned Additional Public Prosecutor on behalf of the Respondent.

The Court made the following: ORDER

ORDER

This Criminal Petition is filed under Section 482 of Bharatiya
Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (for short 'BNSS') for grant of pre-
arrest bail to the petitioner, who is arrayed as accused No.2 in
Crime No.2508 of 2025 before the Madhapur Police Station,

Cyberabad Commissionerate, registered for the offences punishable under Section 316(2), 318 (4) read with 3(5) of BNS.

2. The brief facts of the case are that on 27.12.2025, based on the complaint of Chiranjeevi Mareddy, Crime No.2508/2025 was registered at Madhapur Police Station for offences under Sections 316(2), 318(4) r/w 3(5) BNS. It is alleged that the complainant, while searching for suppliers through IndiaMART, was induced by Accused No.1 representing Suchakra Impex and others connected with Gampa Industries to pay an advance of Rs.1 crore for supply of coal/gypsum and mineral material. After receipt of the amount, the accused allegedly failed to supply the material, issued a cheque which was dishonoured for insufficient funds, and thereafter avoided the complainant, thereby cheating him in furtherance of a conspiracy.

3. Heard Sri Syed Hassan Bin Taher, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner as well as Sri M. Ramachandra Reddy, learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing on behalf of the respondent – State.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that she is innocent and has been falsely implicated only to recover dues from

accused No.1. He contended that the transaction was solely between the complainant and Accused No.1 through IndiaMART, and the petitioner had no role in negotiation, receipt of money, inducement, or any fraudulent act. He further contended that there are only vague and omnibus allegations against her, the dispute is purely civil/commercial in nature, no ingredients of criminal breach of trust or cheating are made out, and she is entitled to anticipatory bail while cooperating with the investigation. Therefore, he prayed the Court to grant pre-arrest bail to the petitioner by allowing this Criminal Petition.

5. Learned Additional Public Prosecutor opposed the anticipatory bail application contending that the petitioner, along with other accused, participated in a planned scheme to cheat the complainant of Rs.1 crore on the false promise of supplying material. He further submitted that the petitioner is connected with Gampa Industries, gave assurances regarding delivery/refund, and is part of the conspiracy. He contended that investigation is at a crucial stage, custodial interrogation is necessary to trace the money trail and role of each accused, and grant of anticipatory bail may hamper the investigation. Hence, he prayed the Court to dismiss the criminal petition.

6. In the light of the submissions made by both the learned counsel and upon perusal of the material available on record, it appears that the allegations pertain to a well-planned cheating of a substantial amount of Rs.1 crore on the false promise of supply of material. The main allegation against the petitioner is that she, in association with other accused, is connected with the entities involved and had participated in the transaction by giving assurances regarding supply of material and refund, thereby forming part of the alleged conspiracy. At this stage, considering the seriousness of the allegations, the magnitude of the amount involved, and the requirement of custodial interrogation to trace the money trail and ascertain the role of each accused, this Court is not inclined to grant pre-arrest bail to the petitioner. Accordingly, the Criminal Petition is liable to be dismissed.

7. Accordingly, this Criminal petition is dismissed.

Miscellaneous applications, if any pending, shall stand closed.

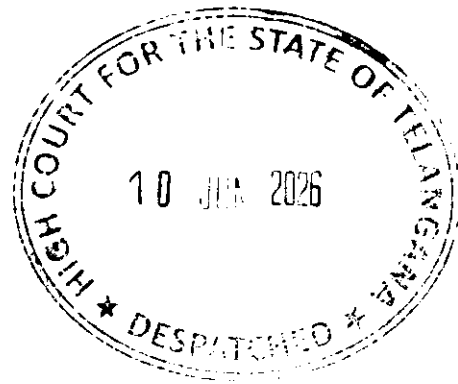
