Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue a writ order or direction especially one, in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declaring that, a) the action of the Respondents in not making payment of terminal benefits to the Petitioner in pursuance of letter/ proceedings issued by the Principal Accountant General (A&E), Hyderabad in Lr.No.AG(A&E)/P15/11/M-374/SP448/2025-07/2225 Dt.11/08/2025 and Lr.No.AG(A and E)/P15/II/M-374/SP448/2025-07/3734 dated 21/10/2025 is illegal, arbitrary and discriminatory, violating Article 14, 16 and 300-A of the Constitution of India. b) further declare that, the Respondents shall forthwith release all terminal benefits payable to the Petitioner including Death-cum-Retirement, Gratuity, Commutation of Pension, General Provident Fund amount and encashment of Earned Leave and Earned Leave amount and other benefits in pursuance of his retirement dated 30/06/2025 and the proceedings in Lr.No.AG(A&E)/P15/II/M-374/SP448/2025-07/2225 d) Dt.11/08/2025 and Lr.No.AG(A&E)/P15/II/M-374/SP448/2025-07/3734 dated 21/10/2025 of the Principal Accountant General (A&E), Hyderabad viz., an amount of Rs.16,00,000/- sanctioned towards retirement gratuity viz., Rs.11,63,130/- sanctioned vide Token

No. 2601914287 dated 18/11/2025 and Rs.4,36,870/-sanctioned vide Token No.2601914291 dated 18/11/2025 respectively, further an amount of Rs.21,31,697/- sanctioned towards Commutation Value of Pension viz., Rs.15,49,650/-sanctioned vide Token No.2601914300 dated 18/11/2025, Rs.5,82,047/- sanctioned vide Token No.2601914312 dated 18/11/2025 and An amount of Rs.53,608/- sanctioned towards another Commutation Value of Pension viz., Rs.38,971/- sanctioned vide Token No.2602559746 dated 30/12/2025 and Rs.14,637/- sanctioned vide token No.2602559753 dated 30/12/2025 respectively, Service Pension of the Petitioner was fixed as Rs.56,255/-, GPF amount of Rs.5,65,451/- sanctioned vide token No.2601070842 dated 14/08/2025, GIS amount of Rs.50,472/- sanctioned vide Token No.2601975530 dated 15/11/2025, Encashment of Earned Leave amount of Rs.16,09,230/- sanctioned vide Token No.2600759547 dated 11/07/2025, Fixation Arrears amount of Rs.71,747/- sanctioned vide token No.2523751571 dated 22.01.2025 and PRC Arrears (12 Bills) amount of Rs.2,91,494/- sanctioned vide different token numbers on 14/08/2025. c) the Respondents have no right or power to withhold the terminal benefits payable to the Petitioner after his retirement.

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Petition under Section 151 CPC praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to direct the Respondents to forthwith release all the terminal benefits payable to the Petitioner in pursuance of the Lr.No.AG(A&E)/P15/II/M-374/SP448/2025-07/2225 Dt.11/08/2025 and Lr.No.AG(A&E)/P15/II/M-374/SP448/2025-07/3734 dated 21.10.2025 of the Principal Accountant General (A&E), Hyderabad viz., an amount of Rs.16,00,000/- sanctioned towards retirement gratuity viz., Rs.11,63,130/- sanctioned vide Token No.2601914287 dated 18/11/2025 and Rs.4,36,870/- sanctioned vide Token No.2601914291 dated 18/11/2025 respectively, further an amount of Rs.21,31,697/- sanctioned towards Commutation Value of Pension viz., Rs.15,49,650/- sanctioned vide Token No.2601914300 dated 18/11/2025, Rs.5,82,047/- sanctioned vide Token No.2601914312 dated 18/11/2025 and An amount of Rs.53,608/-sanctioned towards another Commutation Value of Pension viz., Rs.38,971/- sanctioned vide Token No.2602559746 dated 30/12/2025 and Rs.14,637/- sanctioned vide token No.2602559753 dated 30/12/2025 respectively, Service Pension of the Petitioner was fixed as Rs.56,255/-, GPF amount of Rs.5,65,451/- sanctioned vide token No.2601070842 dated 14/08/2025, GIS amount of Rs.50,472/-sanctioned vide Token No.2601975530 dated 15.11.2025, Encashment of Earned Leave amount of Rs.16,09,230/- sanctioned vide Token No.2600759547 dated 11/07/2025, Fixation Arrears amount of Rs.71,747/- sanctioned vide token No.2523751571 dated 22/01/2025 and PRC Arrears (12 Bills) amount of Rs.2,91,494/- sanctioned vide different token numbers on 14/08/2025 pending disposal of the Writ Petition

ORDER:

Heard Sri G.Jalpath Reddy SVR, learned counsel for the petitioner and learned Assistant Government Pleader for Services-III appearing for the respondents and perused the material on record. With their consent, this Writ Petition is taken up for disposal at the stage of admission itself.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner filed the instant Writ Petition questioning the action of the respondents in not releasing the petitioner's retiral

benefits, despite token numbers having already been raised by the respondent authorities for payment of the amounts payable to the petitioner.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that the *lis* raised in the present Writ Petition has already been adjudicated by the Division Bench of this Court in W.P.No.23138 of 2025, which was disposed of *vide* order dated 03.09.2025, and thus prayed to pass a similar order in the present Writ Petition also.

4. Learned Assistant Government Pleader for Services-III did not dispute the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner with regard to the disposal of W.P.No.23138 of 2025 dated 03.09.2025 and submits that the respondents will release the amounts on a priority basis of the token numbers and prayed this Court to pass appropriate orders.

5. Having regard to the above made submissions and for the reasons alike in the order dated 03.09.2025 passed by the Division Bench of this Court in W.P.No.23138 of 2025, this Writ

Petition is disposed of directing the respondents to ensure that the entire amount payable to the petitioner is released as expeditiously as possible, preferably within a period of six (6) weeks from today, failing which, the entire amount with regard to the retiral benefits shall carry interest at the rate of 10% per annum, from the date the amount fell due, till the actual date of its payment.

Miscellaneous petitions pending, if any, in this Writ Petition, shall stand closed. There shall be no order as to costs.
