This Petition coming on for hearing, upon perusing the Memorandum of Grounds of Criminal Petition and upon hearing the arguments of Sri P.Vamsheedhar Reddy, Advocate for the Petitioner and Sri Jithender Rao Veeramalla, learned Additional Public Prosecutor on behalf of the Respondent No.1 and none appeared for the Respondent No.2.

The Court made the following: ORDER

ORDER

This criminal petition is filed aggrieved by the impugned order dated 26.03.2026 passed by the Additional Junior Civil Judge-cum-Additional Judicial First Class Magistrate at Zaheerabad (for short 'the Trial Court') in CrI.M.P.No.523 of 2026 in CC.No.186 of 2014 where-under, the application filed by the petitioner under Section 70(2) of Cr.P.C, seeking recall of the Non-Bailable Warrant (for short 'NBW') dated 23.03.2026 was dismissed.

2. Heard Sri P. Vamsheedhar Reddy, learned counsel for petitioner, and Mr. Jithender Rao Veeramalla, learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing for respondent No.1.

3. As the petitioner is not seeking any relief against respondent No.2, notice in respect of respondent No.2 is dispensed with.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is suffering from kidney-related problems and he is undergoing dialysis treatment. Due to the same, the petitioner could not appear before the Trial Court in CC.No.186 of 2014 on 23.03.2026. However, inspite of the same, the Trial Court has issued Non-Bailable Warrant on the very same day. Subsequently, the petitioner filed an application under Section 70(2) of Cr.P.C vide Cr.I.M.P.No.523 of 2026 in CC.No.186 of 2014 to recall the NBW dated 23.03.2026, by enclosing Medical Certificate issued by Civil Surgeon or Medical Officer, Osmania General Hospital. However, the Trial Court without properly considering the averments made in support of the application, has erroneously dismissed the said application through order dated 26.03.2026 without assigning any reasons, only on the sole ground that the petitioner was not present physically. Unless this Court recalls the NBW issued against the petitioner, he will be put to great hardship. Learned counsel further submits that the petitioner will appear before the Trial Court through his counsel,

on each and every date of adjournment, whenever his presence is required.

5. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor submitted that the matter is pending since the year 2014. Thus, the Trial Court has rightly issued NBW against the petitioner, as the petitioner has not cooperated before the Trial Court to prosecute the proceedings and there is no irregularity or illegality in the order passed by the Trial Court.

6. Having considered the rival submissions made by the respective parties and upon perusal of the material available on record, it reveals that the petitioner is an accused in C.C.No.186 of 2014, registered for the offences punishable under Section 420 read with 34 of the Indian Penal Code. The learned Trial Court issued NBW against the petitioner on 23.03.2026, thereafter the petitioner filed the application seeking to recall the said NBW on the very same day, by invoking the provisions of Section 70(2) of Cr.P.C. The said application was dismissed by the Trial Court on 26.03.2026. The petitioner has also enclosed a copy of Medical Certificate issued by the Civil Surgeon or Medical Officer, Osmania General Hospital, wherein it is stated that the petitioner has to undergo treatment for a period of 4 weeks i.e, from

23.03.2026. The petitioner has also enclosed the photographs, which reveals that the petitioner's left leg is damaged due to dialysis and ill-health.

7. Taking into consideration the peculiar facts and circumstances of the case, the impugned order dated 26.03.2026, passed by the Additional Junior Civil Judge-cum-Additional Judicial First Class Magistrate at Zaheerabad in CrI.M.P.No.523 of 2026 in CC.No.186 of 2014 is set aside and the NBW dated 23.03.2026 issued against the petitioner is recalled, subject to the conditions that the petitioner/accused No.1 shall furnish a personal bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five thousand only) with two sureties to the satisfaction of the learned Trial Court and also the petitioner shall file an undertaking that he shall be represented through his counsel on each and every date of hearing. If the presence of the petitioner/accused No.1 is required, he shall appear before the trial Court. In case of non-appearance on the specific date fixed by the trial Court for his appearance, the trial Court is entitled to proceed with the matter, in accordance with law.

8. With the above directions, the criminal petition is disposed of, accordingly.

Pending miscellaneous applications, if any, shall stand closed.

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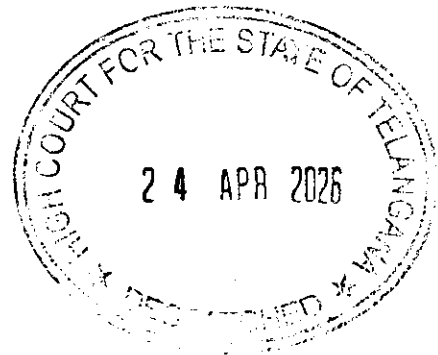
