WHEREAS the Petitioners above named through their Advocate M/s. RVR ASSOCIATES presented this Petition under Section 528 of B.N.S.S. praying that in the circumstances stated in the grounds filed in support of the CRIMINAL PETITION, the High Court may be pleased to quash the proceedings in C.C. No. 803 of 2025, on the file of the learned Junior Civil Judge-cum-Additional Judicial Magistrate of First Class, Ranga Reddy District at Amangal. for the offences alleged under Sections 329(4), 115(2), 351(2), 352, 324(2) read with 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, and 175(3) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, in the interest of justice.

AND WHEREAS the High Court upon perusing the petition and memorandum of grounds filed herein and upon hearing the arguments of Ms. Muskan Joshi, Counsel representing M/s. RVR ASSOCIATES Advocate for the Petitioners, and Additional Public Prosecutor, for the Respondent No.1 directed issue of notice to the Respondent No.2 herein to show cause as to why this CRIMINAL PETITION should not be admitted.

are directed to show cause on or before 09.07.2026 to which date the case stands posted as to why in the circumstances set out in the petition and the memorandum of grounds filed therewith (copy enclosed) this CRIMINAL PETITION should not be admitted.

Petition under Section 528 of B.N.S.S. praying that in the circumstances stated in the grounds filed in support of the CRIMINAL PETITION, the High Court may be pleased to stay all further proceedings in C.C. No. 803 of 2025, on the file of the learned Junior Civil Judge-cum-Additional Judicial Magistrate of First Class, Ranga Reddy District at Amangal, for the offences alleged under Sections 329(4), 115(2), 351(2), 352, 324(2) read with 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, and 175(3) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, pending disposal of the present criminal petition.

The Court made the following:

ORDER

Notice before admission.

Learned Additional Public Prosecutor takes notice on behalf of respondent No.1.

Learned counsel for the petitioners is permitted to take out personal notice to respondent No.2 by way of Speed Post with Acknowledgment Due and file proof of service.

Ms. Muskan Joshi, learned counsel representing RVR Associates submits that respondent No.2 filed the present complaint, invoking the provisions of 175 of BNSS. against the petitioners for the offences under Sections 329(4), 115(2), 351(2), 352, 324(2) read with 3(5) of the BNS. The learned trial Court, without giving an opportunity of hearing, as required under Section 223(1) of the BNSS, referred the matter to the police for investigation, especially without recording any *prima facie* satisfaction and reasons on 16.05.2025. Basing on the same, Crime No.144 of 2025 was registered. However, Investigating Officer conducted investigation and filed final report on 27.09.2025 and the learned trial Court had

taken cognizance of the same. Hence, the continuation of the proceedings against the petitioners is a clear abuse of process of law.

Taking into consideration the aforesaid submissions, this Court is of the view that the grounds raised by the learned counsel for the petitioners require detailed examination.

Post on 09.07.2026.

Till such time, there shall be an interim stay of all further proceedings against the petitioners/accused Nos.1 to 4 in C.C.No.803 of 2025 on the file of the Junior Civil Judge-cum-Additional Judicial Magistrate of First Class, Ranga Reddy District at Amangal.

In default of filing proof of service, the stay stands vacated.
