6. Commissioner, Director of Technical Education, 2nd Floor, Vidya Bhavan, Opp. to Latha Talkies, Nampally, Hyderabad.

Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue an order or direction or a writ, more particularly in the nature of Writ of Mandamus.

- a) Declaring the action of the Respondents in not releasing the admitted due amounts to the Petitioner Institution to the tune of Rs. 24,99,44,400/- Cr under the Reimbursement of Tuition Fee scheme for the SC/ST/EBC/BC/MW students enrolled in the Petitioner Institution for the AY. 2020-2021, 2021-2022, 2022-2023, 2023-2024, 2024-2025 as being wholly arbitrary, illegal, impermissible and unconstitutional apart from being in violation of the fundamental rights of the Petitioners and in contravention of G.O.Ms. No. 50 dated 26.08.2008, G.O.Ms No. 102 dated 29.07.2009, G.O.Ms. No. 66 dated 08.09.2010
- b) Consequently, direct the Respondents to forthwith release the admitted due amounts payable to the Petitioner Institution to the tune of Rs. 24,99,44,400/- Cr under the Reimbursement of Tuition Fee scheme for the SC/ST/EBC/BC/MW students enrolled in the Petitioner Institution for the AY. 2020-2021, 2021-2022, 2022-2023, 2023-2024, 2024-2025 together with interest @18% per annum and further direct the Respondents to disburse the amounts payable to the Petitioner Institution under the Reimbursement of Tuition Fee scheme in a timely manner for all the future academic years
- c) In the alternative, permit the Petitioner Institution to collect the pending tuition fees directly from the SC/ST/EBC/BC/MW students/their parents enrolled in the Petitioner Institution and further direct the Respondents to reimburse the tuition fees directly to the SC/ST/EBC/BC/MW students/their parents enrolled in the Petitioner Institution;

I.A. NO: 1 OF 2026

Petition under Section 151 of C.P.C praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to direct the Respondents to take necessary steps to pay the admitted due amounts to the Petitioner Institution to the tune of Rs.24,99,44,400/- Cr under the Reimbursement of Tuition Fee scheme for the SC/ST/EBC/BC/MW students in the Petitioner Institution, pending disposal of WP No 12822 of 2026, on the file of the High Court.

I.A. NO: 2 OF 2026

Petition under Section 151 of C.P.C praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to permit the Petitioners to collect tuition fees directly from the SC/ST/EBC/BC/MW students/their parents enrolled in the Petitioner Institution without reference to the scheme of Reimbursement of Tuition Fee including G.O.Ms No. 50 dated 26.08.2008, G.O.Ms No. 102 dated 29.07.2009, G.O.Ms. No. 66 dated 08.09.2010 in terms of the order dt. 02.04.2026 in WP. No. 4835 of 2026 and batch, pending disposal of WP No 12822 of 2026, on the file of the High Court.

These petitions coming on for hearing, upon perusing the petitions and the affidavit filed in support thereof and upon hearing the arguments of Sri S. Sri Ram, learned Senior counsel representing Sri Vinay Krishna Kodali Advocate for the Petitioner in all the petitions and Sri S. Rahul Reddy, learned Special G.P. representing Additional Advocate General for the respondents, the Court made the following.

ORDER:

At the request of Ms. Laya, learned counsel representing Sri Vinay Krishna Kodali, learned counsel for the petitioners-institutions, these matters are listed today under the caption "Lunch Motion."

Ms. Laya, learned counsel, submitted that the present writ petitions are connected matters to W.P.No.4835 of 2026 and batch, which were heard and in which interim orders were passed by this Court on 09.07.2026. She further submitted that the petitioners-institutions in the present writ petitions stand on the same footing as the petitioners in the said batch of cases and, therefore, requested this Court to pass similar interim orders in these writ petitions as well.

Heard Sri S. Sri Ram, learned Senior Counsel, representing Sri Vinay Krishna Kodali, learned counsel for the petitioners-institutions.

Having regard to the submissions made and in view of the discussion and reasons assigned in the interim order dated 09.07.2026 passed in W.P.No.4835 of 2026 and batch, this Court deems it appropriate to pass a similar interim order in the present writ petitions also, permitting the implementation of G.O.Ms.No.9, subject to the final outcome of these Writ Petitions, with the following directions:

(i) The petitioners-institutions shall update the particulars of all fresh admissions as well as the details of existing students/renewal applicants studying in the second, third and fourth years of Engineering course and in respect of all courses covered under G.O.Ms.No.9 in the relevant e-PASS portal on or before 15.07.2026.

(ii) Upon such updation and verification of the data, the respondent-authorities shall deposit the fee amounts in respect of all courses covered under G.O.Ms.No.9 pertaining to the existing students/renewal applicants into their respective bank accounts on or before 29.07.2026, thereby enabling the students to remit the said amounts to their respective institutions on or before 31.07.2026.

(iii) Insofar as the fresh admissions are concerned, in respect of all courses covered under G.O.Ms.No.9, the respondent-authorities shall deposit the fee amounts into the bank accounts of the eligible students on or before 15.08.2026, thereby enabling the students to pay the same to their respective institutions.

(iv) The respondent-authorities shall ensure that the e-PASS portal remains active and fully functional at all times for the purpose of facilitating updation, verification, processing and disbursement of

the fee amounts, without causing any hindrance or interruption to the petitioners-institutions or the students.

(v) It is made clear that, in the event of the respondents-authorities failing to deposit the fee amounts within the time stipulated hereinabove, the petitioners-institutions shall be at liberty to collect the requisite fee amounts directly from the students concerned.
