Heard Ponnam Mahesh Babu, learned counsel for the petitioner; learned Government Pleader for Home appearing on behalf of respondent Nos.1, 3, 4 and 7 and Ms.N.V.R.Rajya Lakshmi, learned Central Government Standing Counsel representing Mr.N.Bhujanga Rao, learned Deputy Solicitor General of India, appearing on behalf of respondent Nos.2, 5 and 6

On taking into consideration the set of facts and circumstances of the case, the Lookout Circular issued by respondent authorities against the petitioner shall be kept in abeyance, for a period of four (4) weeks, to the extent of arrival of the petitioner is concerned.

Post the matter on 08.06.2026.

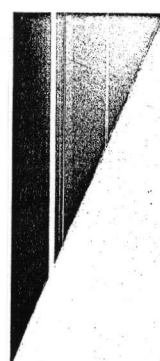
