WHEREAS the Petitioners above named through their Advocate Sri. T NAGENDER presented this Petition under Section 528 of B.N.S.S. praying that in the circumstances stated in the grounds filed in support of the CRIMINAL PETITION, the High Court may be pleased to Quash the CC No.1119/2023 pending on the file of the SPL. Judicial First Class Magistrate (Prohibition and Excise Offence) at Nalgonda District against the Petitioners no. 1 & 2 in the interest of justice.

AND WHEREAS the High Court upon perusing the petition and memorandum of grounds filed herein and upon hearing the arguments of Sri DEEPAK BHATTACHARJEE, Senior Counsel representing Sri. T NAGENDER Advocate for the Petitioners, and Additional Public Prosecutor, for the Respondent No.1 directed issue of notice to the Respondent No.2 herein to show cause as to why this CRIMINAL PETITION should not be admitted.

are directed to show cause on or before 06.08.2026 to which date the case stands posted as to why in the circumstances set out in the petition and the memorandum of grounds filed therewith (copy enclosed) this CRIMINAL PETITION should not be admitted.

I.A. NO: 2 OF 2026

Petition under Section 528 of B.N.S.S. praying that in the circumstances stated in the grounds filed in support of the CRIMINAL PETITION, the High Court may be pleased to grant interim stay of all further proceedings including the appearance of the Petitioners no. 1 & 2 in CC No.1119/2023, before the SPL. Judicial First Class Magistrate (Prohibition and Excise Offence) at Nalgonda district pending final disposal of the main Criminal Petition in the interest of justice.

The Court made the following:

ORDER

Notice before admission.

Learned Additional Public Prosecutor takes notice on behalf of respondent No.1.

Learned counsel for the petitioners is permitted to take out personal notice to respondent No.2 by way of Speed Post with Acknowledgment Due and file proof of service.

Sri Deepak Bhattacharjee, learned Senior Counsel representing Sri T. Nagender, learned counsel for the petitioners, submits that the petitioners have not committed the alleged offence and have been falsely implicated in the present case. Even according to the allegations made in the complaint, the ingredients of the offences under Sections 498-A, 417, 420, 504 read with 34 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, and Section 4 of the Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961 are not attracted against the petitioners. He further submits that petitioner No.1 filed a case before the Superior Court of California, County of Alameda, seeking dissolution of marriage between

him and respondent No. 2. While the said proceedings were pending, respondent No. 2 filed the complaint on 10.05.2023. Basing on the said complaint, Crime No. 54 of 2023 was registered. Respondent No. 2 and the petitioner No.1 entered into a Marital Settlement Agreement. Pursuant to the said Agreement, the Superior Court of California, County of Alameda, allowed the proceedings filed by the petitioner No.1 on 19.08.2024 and dissolved the marriage between petitioner No.1 and respondent No. 2. The said judgment has attained finality. As per the Marital Settlement Agreement, petitioner No.1 paid all the amounts and returned the gold and other articles to respondent No. 2. Hence, continuation of the proceedings against the petitioners is a clear abuse of the process of law.

Taking into consideration the above submissions, this Court is of the view that detailed examination is required for adjudication of the case.

Post on 06.08.2026.

There shall be an interim stay of all further proceedings against the petitioners/accused Nos.1 and 2 in C.C.No.1119 of 2023 on the file of the learned Special Judicial First Class Magistrate (Prohibition and Excise Offence) at Nalgonda, till 31.08.2026. In default of filing proof of service, the stay stands vacated.
