Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue an appropriate Writ, order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declaring the action of the respondents in seizing the paddy from Petitioners rice mill i.e. M/s. Super Binny Rice Mill, Chinthal Cheruvu Village, Hathnoora Mandal, Sangareddy District, which was supplied under Custom Milling Rice scheme pursuant to the panchanama dated 07/04/2026 as illegal, null, void, arbitrary.

2. The petitioner approached the Court seeking prayer as under:

"...to issue an appropriate Writ order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declaring the action of the respondents in seizing the paddy from Petitioner's rice mill i.e., M/s. Super Binny Rice Mill, Chithal Cheruvu Village, Hathnoora Mandal, Sangareddy District, which was supplied under Custom Milling Rice scheme pursuant to the panchanama dated 07.04.2026 as illegal, null, void, arbitrary and to pass such other appropriate orders as are deemed fit and proper in the interests of justice....."

3. The case of the petitioner in brief as per the averments made in the affidavit filed by the petitioner in support of the present Writ Petition is as under:-

The petitioner rice mill has been undertaking Custom Milling Rice (CMR) operations for the Government of Telangana since 2015. On 07.04.2026, the Deputy Tahsildar allegedly inspected the mill premises, and claimed to have found 505 bags of PDS rice inside the mill and 110 bags in an auto bearing No.TG08VP431, and thereafter, the respondent authorities initiated proceedings under Section 6-A of the Essential Commodities Act, 1955 and seized the stock, and directed stoppage of milling operations.

Aggrieved by the same, the petitioner approached this Court by filing the present writ petition.

PERUSED THE RECORD:

A) The relevant portion of the order of this Court dated 20.01.2026 passed in W.P.No.1603 of 2026 is extracted hereunder:

"3. In view of the same, the seizure is set aside and the official respondents are directed to permit the petitioner to mill the seized paddy under the supervision of the concerned authority and supply the rice to respondent No.2-Corporation as per the directions of respondent No.2 within the stipulated period."

DISCUSSION AND CONCLUSION:

4. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner submits that the issue involved in the present writ petition is squarely covered by the order of this Court dated 20.01.2026 passed in W.P.No.1603 of 2026, and hence, the petitioner in the present writ petition is also entitled for the same relief as extended to the petitioner in W.P.No.1603 of 2026.

5. learned Assistant Government Pleader for Civil Supplies appearing on behalf of respondent Nos.1, 3 to 6 and learned Standing Counsel for Civil Supplies Corporation appearing on behalf of respondent No.2 do not dispute the said submission made by the learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner.

6. TAKING INTO CONSIDERATION:

- a) The aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case,
- b) The submissions made by the learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner, learned Assistant Government Pleader for Civil Supplies appearing on behalf of respondent Nos.1, 3 to 6 and the learned Standing Counsel for Civil Supplies Corporation appearing on behalf of respondent No.2,
- c) The orders of this Court dated 20.01.2026 passed in W.P.No.1603 of 2026 (referred to and extracted above)

d) The discussion and conclusion as arrived at paragraph Nos.4 and 5 of the present order,

The writ petition is disposed of in terms of the order of this Court dated 20.01.2026 passed in W.P.No.1603 of 2026 and the seizure dated 07.04.2026 is set aside and the official respondents are directed to permit the petitioner to mill the seized paddy under the supervision of the concerned authority and supply the rice to respondent No.2-Corporation as per the directions of respondent No.2 within the stipulated period. There shall be no order as to costs.

Miscellaneous petitions, if any, pending in this Writ Petition, shall stand closed.

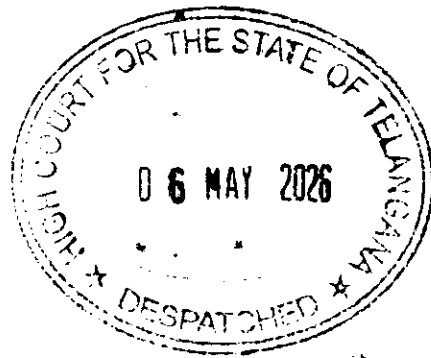
