WHEREAS the Petitioner above named through his Advocate SRI M DAMODAR REDDY presented this Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue an order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declaring the action of the respondents in not completing the survey as proposed in File No. A3/265/2024 on the file of 3rd respondent in between the land of petitioner in Sy.No. 231 and the land of 5th respondent and his family members in Sy.No. 230 at Nandimall village, Amarchinga mandal, Wanaparthy District only on the ground that 5th respondent and his family members have been obstructing the survey is illegal and unlawful contrary to law and consequently direct the respondent to complete the survey and fix the boundaries in between above the lands of the petitioner and 5th respondent with the police protection as proposed by the 3rd respondent vide his letter dated 26-3-2025 so as to enable the petitioner to cultivate the land in Sy.No. 231.

AND WHEREAS the High Court upon perusing the petition and affidavit filed herein and upon hearing the arguments of Sri. M DAMODAR REDDY Advocate for the Petitioner, Mr. L.Ravinder, Assistant GP FOR REVENUE, for the respondent Nos. 1 to 4, directed issue of notice to the Respondent No. 5, herein to show cause as to why this WRIT PETITION should not be admitted.

are directed to show cause on or before 20.07.2026 to which date the case stands posted as to why in the circumstances set out in the petition and the affidavit filed therewith (copy enclosed) this WRIT PETITION should not be admitted.

I.A. NO: 1 OF 2026

Petition under Section 151 of C.P.C praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the writ petition, the High Court may be pleased To issue interim order directing the respondents to conduct survey in File No. A3/265/2024 on the file of the 3rd respondent and fix the boundaries in between the land of petitioner in Sy.No. 231 and the land of 5th respondent and his family members in Sy.No. 230 at Nandimall village, Amarchinta Mandal, Wanaparthy District with police protection as proposed by the 3rd respondent vide his letter dated 26.3.2025 addressed to 4th respondent, pending disposal of WP No 14914 of 2026, on the file of the High Court.

The Court made the following:

ORDER

Issue notice to respondent No.5.

Learned counsel for the petitioner is permitted to take out personal notice to respondent No.5 and file proof of service by the next date of hearing.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that on the survey application dated 09.12.2024 submitted by the petitioner in respect of the land in Survey No.231, situated at Nadndimall Village, Amarchinga Mandal, Wanaparthy District, notice dated 24.02.2025 was issued to respondents No.5 and 6 and the adjoining land owners. Respondent No.5 raised objection to the survey and approached the Station House Officer (SHO), Amarchintha and thereafter, respondent No.3 issued letter dated 26.03.2025 directing respondent No.4 to conduct survey by taking Police protection. Learned counsel submitted that despite such letter, respondent No.4 is not conducting survey and instead the Revenue Divisional Officer, Wanaparthy, passed the

order dated 20.03.2025 in proceedings No.I/619/2024 dated 20.03.2025 recommending proceedings under Section 164 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (BNSS) to be initiated. Learned counsel further submitted that assuming there is law and order issue and likelihood of breach of peace, still respondent No.4 cannot abdicate his duties and dodge conducting of survey.

Mr. L.Ravinder, learned Assistant Government Pleader for Revenue, appearing for respondents No.1 to 4, basing on the written instructions, submitted that the Deputy Inspector of Survey and Land Record along with staff visited the spot i.e. Survey No.231 of Nandimalla Village, Amarchintha Mandal, on 11.03.2025 but the adjacent pattadars objected for conducting survey and demarcation of the land. Even in the presence of Police personnel, the pattedars did not cooperate. It is further submitted that previously the Deputy Inspector of Survey and Land Records conducted inspection under the cover of panchanama dated 01.02.2012.

In the opinion of this Court, the respondent authorities cannot be permitted to say that there are law and order issues and that objections are raised by the adjoining pattedars but rather they are bound to conduct survey by taking necessary assistance of the concerned Police personnel.

Hence, there shall be interim direction to respondent No.4 to complete the process of survey if necessary by taking assistance of the concerned Police personnel, within a period of forty five (45) days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.
