Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to pass an order, or orders, direction or directions, or issue a writ, more particularly in the nature of Writ of Mandamus, Declaring the action of Respondent No.2 i.e. District Collector and District Magistrate Adilabad in cancelling the B.C. (E) Certificate issued in favour of petitioner vide No.CND021815268831 Dated. 27-12-2018, through proceedings vide No. vide Proc.No.C3/8/0042/2025 Dated 09-04-2026 is illegal,

arbitrary, violative of Article 14, 21 of the Constitution of India and against the mandatory provisions of Telangana State (SC, ST and BC) Regulation of issue of community certificate Act 1993 and set aside the said impugned proceedings.

ORDER:

This writ petition is filed seeking the following relief:

".... to issue an order, or orders, direction or directions, or
issue a writ, more particularly in the nature of Writ of
Mandamus, declaring the action of respondent No.2 i.e.,
District Collector & District Magistrate, Adilabad in cancelling
the B.C(E) Certificate issued in favour of petitioner *vide*
No.CND021815268831, dated 27.12.2018, *vide* Proceedings
No.C3/8/0042/2025, dated 09.04.2026, is illegal, arbitrary,
violative of Articles 14 and 21 of the Constitution of India
and against the mandatory provisions of Telangana State (SC,

ST & BC) Regulation of Issue of Community Certificate Act, 1993 and set aside the said impugned proceedings and to pass any such other order or orders."

Heard Sri S.Chandra Sekhar, learned counsel for the petitioner, learned Government Pleader for Social Welfare appearing for respondent No.1, Learned Government Pleader for Revenue appearing for respondent Nos.2 and 3 and Sri G.Venkatesh, learned counsel appearing for respondent No.4.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner contested in election conducted in the year 2025 for the post of Sarpanch and he was a successful candidate and that respondent No.4 also contested for the same post and he was an unsuccessful candidate. Learned counsel further submits that with a *mala fide* intention, respondent No.4 has filed a complaint before respondent No.2 alleging that the petitioner is not coming under B.C (E) Category and that without conducting property enquiry, respondent No.2 has cancelled the B.C (E) certificate of the petitioner *vide* proceedings dated 09.04.2026. Learned counsel further submits that against the said cancellation, the petitioner has filed statutory appeal before respondent No.1 and pending

the said appeal, respondent No.2 issued disqualification notice dated 16.4.2026.

When the statutory appeal is pending before respondent No.1, respondent No.2 ought not to have issued disqualification notice dated 16.04.2026.

In view of the same, the Writ Petition is disposed of directing respondent No.2 not to take any action pursuant to disqualification notice dated 16.04.2026 and respondent No.1 is directed to dispose of the statutory appeal preferred by the petitioner within a period of eight weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order. No costs.

Miscellaneous petitions, pending, if any, shall stand closed.
