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the equity and set aside the same, consequently direct the Respondent No.2 to grant permission to the Petitioner to run the exhibition at Open Land in Sy.No.2403 & 2404 situated at opposite Bus Depot, Nirmal, for the period from 01.05.2026 to 20.06.2026.

ORDER

The present writ petition is filed with the following prayer:

".....to issue Writ, Order or Direction, or any other appropriate Order one in the nature of a Writ Of Mandamus, declaring the action of the respondent no.2 not issuing NOC in favour of petitioner for conducting exhibition at open land in Sy.No.2403 & 2404 situated at opposite Bus Depot, Nirmal, for the period from 01.05.2026 to 20.06.2026, as illegal, arbitrary in violation of principles of natural justice and against the equity and set aside the same consequently direct the respondent No.2 to grant permission to the petitioner to run the exhibition at open land in SY.No.2403 & 2404 situated at opposite bus depot, Nirmal, for the period from 01.05.2026 to 20.06.2026, and pass such other order or orders this Hon'ble Court deems fit and proper in the circumstances of the case"



2. Heard Mr. M.A.K. Mukheed, learned counsel for the petitioner, learned Assistant Government Pleader for Revenue appearing for respondent Nos.1 to 4, learned Standing Counsel for Municipality appearing for respondent No.5 and learned Assistant Government Pleader for Home appearing for respondent Nos.6 to 8 and perused the material on record.

3. The case of the petitioner, in brief, is that the petitioner is conducting exhibitions/circus events at various places across the country and had applied before the respondent authorities seeking grant of permission/No Objection Certificate (NOC) to conduct an exhibition in the open land situated in Sy.Nos.2403 and 2404, opposite Bus Depot, Nirmal, for the period from 01.05.2026 to 20.06.2026. Pursuant to an enquiry, the respondent authorities issued a No Objection Certificate vide proceedings dated 23.04.2026 and the other concerned departments had also granted the necessary NOCs. The grievance of the petitioner is that, despite completion of all formalities and expenditure of huge amounts towards erection of tents and other establishments, respondent No.2 has not granted final permission/NOC for conducting the exhibition, notwithstanding the representation dated 20.04.2026, thereby



causing huge financial loss to the petitioner. Aggrieved thereby, the present writ petition came to be filed.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that though the application was made as early as on 20.04.2026, there is unexplained inaction on the part of respondent No.2 in disposing of the said application for grant of permission. Learned counsel further submits that permissions from the other departments namely, Fire Department, Police Department and Municipality, have already been obtained and any delay in disposing of the application would cause grave loss to the petitioner, inasmuch as the exhibition was proposed to be conducted only until 20.06.2026.

5. On the other hand, the learned Assistant Government Pleader for Revenue submits that the application of the petitioner dated 20.04.2026 shall be considered and disposed of expeditiously.

6. Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned Assistant Government Pleader for Revenue, and in view of the above submissions, respondent No.2-District Collector is directed to consider the application of the petitioner dated 20.04.2026 and dispose of the same in accordance with

law, positively within a period of seven (07) days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.

7. Accordingly, the Writ Petition is dismissed. There shall be no order as to costs.

As a sequel, miscellaneous petitions, pending if any, stand closed.
