Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue a writ, order or direction more particularly one in the nature of writ of mandamus declaring the 5th respondent Lr. No. 123/CWC/SRPT/2025 dated 28.05.2025 as illegal, arbitrary against the principles of natural justice and in contrary to the directions of this Hon'ble High Court in Writ Appeal. Nos. 1193, 1128, 1228, 1257, 1260, 1265, 1266, 1267, 1268 and 1277 of 2024, Dated. 28-11-2024, in contrary to the provisions of the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015 and violative of Articles 14 and 21 of the Constitution of India and against the Common Order in WP. No. 22020 of 2024 and batch, Dated. 23-09-2024. Consequently, to suspend the order in Lr. No. 123/CWC/SRPT/2025 dated 28.05.2025, while directing the 5th Respondent to handover the minor child aged about 27 months at the time to

the Petitioners in terms of section 37(1)(b) of the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015 by considering the Common Order in WP. No. 22020 of 2024 and batch, Dated. 23-09-2024, Order in SLP. No. 6322 of 2025 and batch, Dated. 12-08-2025 and batch;

Petition under Section 151 of C.P.C praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to suspend the order in Lr. No. 123/CWC/SRPT/2025 dated 28.05.2025, while directing the 5th Respondent to handover the minor child aged about 27 months at the time to the Petitioners in terms of section 37(1)(b) of the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015 by considering the Common Order in WP. No. 22020 of 2024 and batch, Dated. 23-09-2024, Order in SLP. No. 6322 of 2025 and batch, Dated. 12-08-2025, pending disposal of WP No 17403 of 2026, on the file of the High Court.

The petition coming on for hearing, upon perusing the petition and the affidavit filed in support thereof and upon hearing the arguments of Sri Chalakani Venkat Yadav Advocate for the Petitioners, Assistant GP for Women Development and Child Welfare for the respondent No. 1 to 3, 5, 8 and 9 and Smt Kavitha Yadav Advocate for the respondent No. 4, the Court made the following.

ORDER:

Heard Sri Chalakani Venkat Yadav, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners, Smt. Kavita Yadav, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the respondent No.4 and the learned Assistant Government Pleader for Women Development and Child Welfare appearing on behalf of the official respondent Nos.1 to 3, 5, 8 and 9.

Respondents are directed to continue the custody of the minor child.

Respondents are further directed not to initiate any steps to give the minor child, in adoption. The said child shall remain in the care and protection of the institution where the child is presently in care and protection and is presently residing, until the counter affidavits are filed by the respondents.

The petitioners are permitted to visit the minor child, once a fortnight and spend time with the said minor child in the presence of one of the concerned official of the said institution for one hour at the said institution.

List the matter on 11.06.2026 along with W.P.No.26848 of 2025 for counter of respondents.
