Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue an order or direction more particularly one in the nature of writ of mandamus or any other appropriate writ declaring the action of the respondent authorities in issuing G.O. Ms. No. 7 dated 08-05-2026 and its consequential notice Lr. No. M2/2450/2KMS 2022-23/e-Auction, dated -05-2026, demanding the petitioner to pay the amount for the quantity of the paddy shown in the said notice alias Rs. 2,236.81/- per quintal, prior to determining the same, without looking into the quality of the paddy, as the paddy which was allotted to the petitioner's rice mill is a poor quality and for all these years i.e., from 2022-23 to till date it is deteriorated, without taking any steps for deducting the charges i.e., Handling and unloading charges (Hamali), Moisture loss and consequential weight reduction, Godown rent and storage charges and other incidental charges necessary for safeguarding the stock, without issuing any notice and without giving any opportunity of hearing to the petitioner and without passing any orders considering the explanation/representation dated 06-07-2026, for determining the rate of the paddy per quintal, by duly following

the orders of this Hon'ble Court passed in W.P. No. 24750 of 2023, dated 08-09-2023 and now taking coercive steps by constituting the teams for collection of the amounts shown in the notice, is nothing but arbitrary, illegal, null and void and violative of principles of natural justice and also violative of Articles 14, 19 and 21 of the Constitution of India. Consequently, set aside the G.O. Ms. No.7 dated 08-05-2026 and its consequential notice Lr. No. M2/2450/2KMS 2022-23/e-Auction dated -05-2026, thereby direct the respondent authorities to consider the representation/explanation dated 06-07-2026 submitted by the petitioner before proceeding for the demand of the amount for the stock of paddy of the season Rabi 2022-23, from the petitioner, by giving due opportunity of hearing and following the directions of this Hon'ble Court as stated above, and to pass

Petition under Section 151 of C.P.C praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the writ petition, the High Court may be pleased to suspend the G.O. Ms. No. 7 dated 08-05-2026 and its consequential notice in Lr. No. M2/2450/2KMS 2022-23/e-Auction dated -05-2026, pending disposal of WP No 22405 of 2026, on the file of the High Court.

The petition coming on for hearing, upon perusing the petition and the affidavit filed in support thereof and upon hearing the arguments of Sri K Venumadhav Advocate for the Petitioner, GP For Civil Supplies for the Respondent Nos. 1, 3 & 4, and Sri K Devender, standing Counsel for the respondent Nos. 2, 5 & 6, the Court made the following.

ORDER

Heard Sri K. Venumadhav, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner.

The respondents are directed not to take coercive steps against the petitioner in the present writ petition.
