Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue a Writ, order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declaring the action of the respondents in removing the petitioner from service vide impugned Proc.No.P.VIII.11/2016-23-EC-2, dated 07/03/2017 and consequential rejection orders passed in appeal vide Order No.R-XIII-II/2019-EC-3, dated 21/8/2019, without giving any notice or opportunity as highly illegal, arbitrary and also disproportionate to the charge and consequentially the Hon'ble court may pleased to set aside both the orders dated 07/03/2017 and 21/8/2019 with further direction to the respondents herein to reinstate the petitioner into service as Constable (GD), CRPF with all consequential benefits.

ORDER:

This writ petition is filed seeking to declare the action of the respondents in removing the petitioner from service vide proceedings in Proc. No.P.VIII.11/2016-23-EC-2, dated 07.03.2017, and the consequential rejection orders passed in Appeal vide Order No.R-XII-II/2019-EC-3, dated 21.08.2019, as illegal, arbitrary, and violative of the principles of natural justice.

2. Learned counsel for the respondents submitted that a counter-affidavit has been filed, stating that the petitioner has to avail alternative remedy by way of revocation under the relevant rules, and therefore, the writ petition is not maintainable.

3. At this juncture, learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is willing to avail the remedy of revocation and requested that this writ petition may be disposed of granting liberty to pursue the said remedy.

4. In view of the above submissions made by both the parties, this Court deems it appropriate to dispose of the writ petition, granting liberty to the petitioner to file an appropriate application before the competent revisionary/appellate authority under Rules 28 and 29 of the CRPF Rules, 1955. If such an application is filed, respondent No.3 shall consider and dispose of the same, in accordance with law, as expeditiously as possible, preferably within a period of three (03) months from the date of receipt of such application.

5. Accordingly, the writ petition is disposed of. No order as to costs.

Miscellaneous applications, if any, pending in this writ petition, shall stand closed.

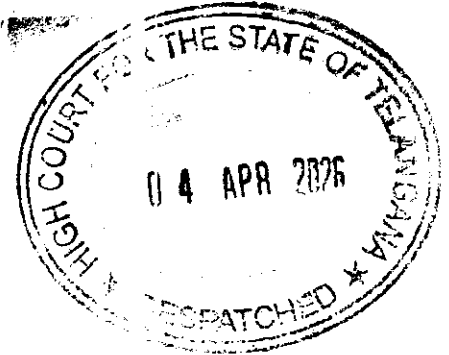
