Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue a order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus considering the act of respondent No.3, calling Petitioner to its authority, confining Petitioner and siting in to the Police station, as of arbitrary, Uncalled, Unjustifiable, Unguided, consequentially, forbear the respondent No.3, forbear, from interfering in to Petitioner Personnel Life and life, without Following due Process of law;

IA NO: 1 OF 2024

Petition under Section 151 CPC praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to direct the respondent No.3, from interfering in to Personnel Life and Liberty of the Petitioner, without due Following due Process of law, pending disposal of WP 24804 of 2024, on the file of the High Court.

The Petition coming on for hearing, upon perusing the Petition and the affidavit filed in support thereof and upon hearing the arguments of Sri M Rathan Singh, Advocate for the Petitioner, GP For Home, for the Respondents and the Court made the following.

ORDER

Mr. R. Laxmikanth Reddy, learned Assistant Government Pleader for Home, basing on the written instructions dated 06.09.2024, submitted that the mother of the

petitioner by name Ms. Meena Nanekar lodged complaint dated 04.09.2024 with respondent No.3 - the Station House Officer, Neredmet Police Station, stating that her son (the petitioner herein) beat her on her cheek when she asked him 'as to why he has come to the house in a drunken condition'. The petitioner and his wife abused the complainant (the mother of the petitioner) in filthy language. On receipt of such complaint, an entry was made in the General Diary to know the veracity in the contents of the said complaint. Respondent No.3 tried to contact the petitioner; the petitioner did not turn up at the Police Station and instead, on a mere apprehension, filed this writ petition.

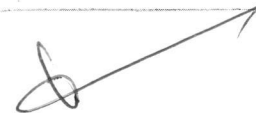
Mr. M. Ratan Singh, learned counsel for the petitioner, submitted that the Police are interfering in the civil disputes and frequently calling the petitioner to the Police Station on day-to-day basis, thereby depriving his personal liberty.

In the circumstances, respondent No.3 is directed not to interfere with the personal liberty of the petitioner without following due process of law.
