1.	09.12.2025	<u>KL,J & VRKR,J</u> <u>LAAS (SR).Nos.43296, 43303, 43305, 43307, 43309, 43312, 43315, 43318, 43321, 43322, 43324, 43325 and 43326 of 2025</u> These appeals are preferred challenging the Awards passed in the LAOPs filed by the claimants, by the Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Authority, for the State of Telangana at Hyderabad. Registry has taken the following objection. “Batta is to be paid”. Learned counsel for the petitioner has resubmitted the bundle with the following explanation. “There are more than 1500 claimants in all the batch of appeals. Hence, payment of Batta may be dispensed with. If not satisfied with the compliance, the matters may be placed before the court for Orders on office objections.” Sri L.Dayakar Reddy, Sri S.V.Ramana, Sri Potluri Srinivas, and Sri Gudi Madhusudhan Reddy, learned counsel would submit that they have instructions to appear on behalf of the respondents/claimants. On instructions, they would further submit that some of the claimants are no more and they have sought time to furnish the details of the legal representatives of dead claimants. Perusal of record would reveal that there are about	

		1500 claimants and some of them are no more. In the light of the same, under special circumstances, so as to enable all the claimants to settle the dispute before Lok-Adalat, the objection raised by the Registry is overruled, for the present dispensing with payment of batta. However, if the matters are not settled before Lok Adalat, appellants shall pay the batta. Registry is directed to number the appeals, if the same are otherwise in order. KL,J VRKR,J kvs	
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
