Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue a Writ of Mandamus or any other appropriate writ declaring that the action of the respondents in restricting the freedom of movement of the petitioner and his foreign/domestic travel on account of FIR No.A11191011240275 of 2024, dated 22.10.2024 of the 3rd respondent, is arbitrary, illegal and violative of Articles 14 and 21 of the Constitution of India and resultantly set aside the said lookout circular against the petitioner and direct the respondents not to interfere with the foreign travel/domestic travel of the petitioner in any respect whatsoever and grant.
