Petition filed under Article 226 of Constitution of India praying that in the circumstances stated in the petition and letter dt. 19-11-2018 and 27-11-2018 addressed by the petitioner herein, to to issue Writ or direction one or more particularly in the nature of Writ, Order or direction one or more particularly in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declaring the action of the respondents in not preventing the dengue and Malaria fever in the various districts of Telengana state as illegal, void, arbitrary in the interest of justice and consequently direct the respondents No. 2 & 4 to provide quality treatment to Dengue & Malaria patients in Telangana State by increasing the number of beds in primary health centres not less than 50 beds and also not less than 200 beds in area hospitals of each district of Telangana State especially for dengue and Malaria patients and

pass such other order or orders as this Hon'ble Court may deem fit and proper in the circumstances of the case.

These petitions coming on for hearing, upon perusing the petitions and the letter dt.19-11-2018 and 27-11-2018 filed in support thereof, and the orders of the High Court dated 24-04-2019, 30-04-2019, 12.07.2019, 7.9.2019, 11.9.2019, 25.9.2019, 23.10.2019, 24.10.2019, 08.11.2019, 15-11-2019, 29-11-2019, 23.12.2019 & 10.01.2020 made herein, and upon hearing the arguments of Sri K.Pawan Kumar, Advocate for the Petitioners in all the petitions, and of Sri B.S. Prasad, Advocate General for the Respondents in all petitions, the Court made the following;

ORDER:

“The learned Advocate General informs this Court that in compliance of the order dated 10-01-2020, a more detailed report has been submitted on 24-01-2020. The same shall be taken on record.

However, a bare perusal of the affidavit filed by Dr. P. Vikram Kumar, the respondent No. 5, clearly reveals that the H1N1 chips for the 14 true NAT machines have yet to be procured. Therefore, the respondent No. 5 is directed to inform this Court as to how soon these chips can be procured. He is further directed to clarify the nature of the NAT machines.

Moreover, by order dated 10-01-2020, this Court had also directed the respondent No. 4, the Director of Public Health and Family Welfare, to submit a detailed report with regard to the implementation of the instructions issued by Memo dated 27-12-2019. So far, the respondent No. 4 has not filed the said report. Therefore, the respondent No. 4 is directed to comply with the order dated 10-01-2020.

By order dated 24-10-2019, this Court had constituted a committee under the Chairmanship of the Chief Secretary. Therefore, the Chief Secretary is directed to submit a report with regard to the implementation of the instructions issued by Memo dated 27-12-2019, and with regard to the implementation of the recommendations made in the H1N1 (Swineflu) Technical Committee Meeting dated 02-01-2020, before this Court on or before 26-02-2020.
