1. Heard the learned Counsel for the parties.
2. Mr. Bhise, learned Counsel for the Respondents – original Plaintiffs, on



instructions, submits that the Respondents – original Plaintiffs, have no objection to allow the Petitions and the applications for amendment in the additional written statements.

In view of the aforesaid submission and the fact that the applications for amendment in the additional written statements are required to be considered liberally as the Defendant is entitled to take additional, alternative and even inconsistent defences and the potentiality of prejudice to the Plaintiff is remote, the Writ Petitions deserve to be allowed.
