Already twelve weeks time has been granted, however, despite granting twelve weeks time, the office objections are not removed.</p> <p>Here reference to Chapter V of the Bombay High Court, Appellate Side Rules, 1960 (for short "Rules") may be conveniently made. It states about procedure after presentation, removal of office objections etc.</p> <p>In view of provisions under Chapter V, Rule 3(ii), the Advocates/Parties are expected to remove the office objections within 14 days from the date of notification.</p> <p>Rule (5) further provides that, if the office objections are not removed as provided under Rule 3, the office shall place the matter before the Registrar, who shall refuse the registration of all such matters.</p> | |

The prescribed time to remove the office objections provided under Rule 1960 has been expired. 12 weeks time was granted, however, Advocate for the Applicant has removed only part of the office objections. Still few office objections are pending.

Hence, two weeks time (excluding Summer Vacation) is granted with directions to remove the remaining office objections without fail. On failure, Second Appeal would stand dismissed, without further reference to the Court of Registrar. No further extension will be granted.
