1. The Contempt Petition is filed alleging willful disobedience of the order dated 07.11.2024, when the Court passed the following order:

“1. Pursuant to the last order, today, the Respondent has appeared in-person. She submits that she never had any problem with the Applicant’s mother i.e., her mother-in-law or her sister-in-law visiting the children. She submitted that they may do so after giving her prior intimation of the time of their visit. She additionally submits that the Applicant today is in arrears of maintenance for an amount in excess of Rs.10 Lakhs.

2. To this, the learned Counsel for the Applicant submits that the Applicant undertakes to clear the arrears of maintenance within a period of two months from today in eight equal installments payable on Monday of every week.

3. Let the Application insofar as the Applicant's visitation rightly be considered by the regular Court."

2. Since the learned counsel would submit that the said order is not complied with and no amount is received by the Petitioner, we deem it appropriate to issue notice to the Respondent, calling upon him to show cause as to why action under the Contempt of Court Act shall not be initiated against him for non-compliance with the directions issued by this Court on 07.11.2024.

The Contemner, upon receipt of notice through the Registry, is at liberty to file his reply showing cause, if any, within a period of six weeks.
