1. This Court is informed that the dispute has been amicably settled between the parties.
2. The Consent Terms are tendered which are taken on record and marked 'X' for identification.
3. The Consent Terms are signed by proprietor of Defendant No. 1 and by proprietor of Defendant No. 2 and by authorized signatory of Plaintiff. The proprietor of Defendant No. 1 and Defendant No. 2 are present virtually and reiterates the terms of the Consent Terms. Their

identity is verified from the aadhar card which is placed on record. They submit to a decree on admission in terms of prayer clauses (a), (b) and (c) of the plaint.

4. The suit is decreed against Defendants in terms of prayer clauses (a), (b) and (c) of the plaint.

5. Refund of Court-fees as per rules.

6. Court Receiver's Report is disposed of. Court Receiver is discharged without passing of accounts. All costs, charges and expenses of the Court Receiver to be paid by Plaintiff within period of eight days on demand being raised by Court Receiver.
