1. This Leave Petition seeks leave under Clause XII of the Letters Patent Act.
2. When the matter is called out, Mr. Khandekar, learned Counsel appears for the Petitioner and submits that in the Suit proposed to be filed by the Petitioner for injunction and damages for infringement of copy right and for breach of confidentiality, where the proposed Defendants are outside the jurisdiction of this Court, the effect of the infringement and breaches having been partly felt in Mumbai and partly outside and although the material part of cause of action has arisen within the jurisdiction of this Court, however, part of cause of action would have arisen outside jurisdiction of this Court and with



leave granted by this Court under Clause XII of the Letters Patent, this Court would have jurisdiction to entertain, try and dispose of the Suit.

4. Mr. Khandekar draws this Court's attention to paragraphs 3 to 6 of the Leave Petition and paragraph 77 of the Complaint in the proposed Suit in support of his contentions.

5. Having heard the learned Counsel and having considered his submissions and also having perused paragraphs 3 to 6 of the Leave Petition and paragraph 77 of the Complaint, this Court is of the view that, for reasons as contained in the said paragraphs and as submitted by the learned Counsel, leave under Clause XII of the Letters Patent be granted and is hereby granted in terms of prayer Clause (a) of the Petition, which reads thus:

“(a) that the Petitioner be granted leave under Clause XII of the Letters Patent to file the suit as proposed in this Hon'ble Court against the Respondents for breach of confidentiality, spring-boarding along with copyright infringement.”

6. The Petition accordingly stands allowed and disposed as above.
