2. By this petition, the petitioner is seeking extension of parole leave,
for further period of 30 days.

3. It is the contention of the petitioner that his wife is suffering from
hypertension, depression, high BP and heart ailments. The petitioner was
released from jail on 25.03.2026 for the treatment of his ailing wife by granting
parole for 40 days. As health condition of his wife was somewhat stable, the
petitioner took her to Government Medical College, Nagpur for Echocardiogram
and coronary angiography on 17th April, 2026. There he was asked to deposit
Rs.2,00,000/- for the same. Due to the financial constraints, he could not deposit
the said amount and therefore he has to arrange the said amount. It is therefore
contended by the petitioner that the parole be extended for 30 days.

4. Learned Additional Public Prosecutor strongly opposed the said contention and submitted that considering the ailments of the wife, the sufficient period was granted to the petitioner and therefore it is not a fit case for extension of parole.

5. After hearing both the sides and on perusal of the record it reveals that on the ground of ailments of wife, parole of 40 days to the petitioner was granted and he was supposed to surrender before the Superintendent of Police, Central Prison, Nagpur on 05.05.2026. However, this petition is moved by the petitioner stating that his wife is not well and she is in need of the treatment.

6. We are doubtful about the fact that he was asked to deposit Rs.2,00,000/- for the same and therefore learned Additional Public Prosecutor to take necessary instructions to that effect from the Government Medical College, Nagpur. The petition is supported by the medical documents. The medical certificate was issued on the request of the petitioner. Learned Additional Public Prosecutor to seek instructions from the Government Medical College, Nagpur regarding the medical treatment required for the wife of the petitioner.

7. At this stage, we do not find any ground to extend the parole and therefore we are extending the period of parole further by one week to surrender the petitioner before the authorities on or before 14.05.2026.

8. Hence, we proceed to pass the following order.

i. The period of parole is extended by further one week till 14.05.2026 by which time the petitioner shall surrender before the Superintendent of Police, Central Prison, Nagpur.

ii. Learned Additional Public Prosecutor is requested to seek instructions regarding to deposit of money for the treatment of the wife of the petitioner as well as the medical record regarding the ailments of the wife of the petitioner.

9. Stand over after vacation.
