1. The petitioners have approached this Court alleging contempt on the ground that the respondents have not complied with the order dated 11.03.2026, passed by this Court in Writ Petition No.136 of 2025. The relevant portion of the order reads as under :

*“5. As far as the contention of the learned counsel for the petitioners regarding they being continued in their service by virtue of the Government Resolution dated 28.01.2019 and more particularly Clause 3 thereof, we direct the respondent no.2 to consider the individual claims of the petitioners in accordance with law and to pass an order thereon. The petitioners to appear before the respondents on 17.03.2026.”*

2. As could be seen, this Court directed Respondent No.2 to consider the individual claims of the petitioners in accordance with law and thereafter, to pass an order thereon.

3. We, accordingly, inquired with the petitioners' counsel as to what was the individual claim of the petitioners, to which the counsel failed to give convincing answer, and sought time to place on record the documents.

4. Thus, it appears that, without examining the niceties of the order, the petitioners have approached this Court alleging

contempt. Nonetheless, we grant time to the petitioners to place before us their individual claims and further call upon to put forth on affidavit as to on what basis, they claim that Respondent No.2 has willfully disobeyed the order.
