Habeas Corpus Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India to issue a Writ of Habeas Corpus to call for the records relating to the detention order in No.58/TNPD/APC/2026 dated 18.03.2026 passed by the



second respondent under the TN Act 14 of 1982 and quash the same and direct the respondents to produce the detenu Mani @ Redhills Mani, aged 21 years, S/o.Raju, who is presently confined in the Central Prison, Puzhal, Chennai, before this Court and set him at liberty.

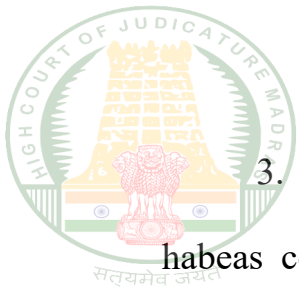

ORDER

(made by N.Sathish Kumar J.)

The petitioner, who is the mother of the detenu Mani @ Redhills Mani, aged 21 years, S/o.Raju, has come forward with this petition challenging the detention order passed by the second respondent dated 18.03.2026 bearing reference Memo No.58/TNPD/APC/2026 branding him as "Drug Offender" under the Tamil Nadu Prevention of Dangerous Activities of Bootleggers, Drug Offenders, Forest Offenders, Goondas, Immoral Traffic Offenders, Sand Offenders, Slum Grabbers and Video Pirates Act, 1982 [Tamil Nadu Act 14 of 1982].

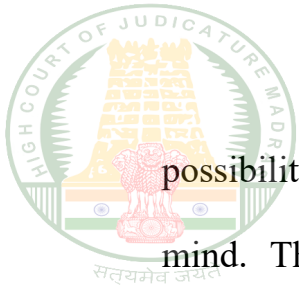
2. Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the respondents.



3. Though several grounds have been raised by the petitioner in the habeas corpus petition assailing the detention order, in the hearing, learned counsel for the petitioner confined his argument only with regard to non-application of mind on the part of the detaining authority in arriving at the subjective satisfaction regarding imminent possibility of detenu being enlarged on bail while passing the impugned order of detention.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the detenu was arrested and remanded to judicial custody in connection with the ground case and five adverse cases, but, the detenu has not moved any bail application in respect of the ground case and therefore, there is no real possibility of the detenu coming out on bail in the near future. However, the detaining authority while passing the impugned detention order, arrived at the subjective satisfaction regarding imminent possibility of coming out on bail by relying on a bail order in Crl.M.P.No.1414 of 2021.

5. In this regard, the learned counsel drew the attention this Court to the order in Crl.M.P.No.1414 of 2021, which is enclosed at Page No.159 in Volume-II of the booklet. A perusal of the said order shows that there was no previous cases pending against the accused therein, whereas, there are six previous cases pending against the detenu herein and therefore, the subjective satisfaction arrived at by the detaining authority regarding the imminent



possibility of detenu being enlarged on bail shows clear non-application of mind. Therefore, the impugned preventive detention order deserves to be dislodged.

In the result, this habeas corpus petition is allowed and the detention order passed by the second respondent dated 18.03.2026 in Memo No.58/TNPD/APC/2026 is hereby set aside and the detenu viz. Mani @ Redhills Mani, aged 21 years, S/o.Raju, is directed to be set at liberty forthwith unless he is required in connection with any other case.
