Mr.K.V.Sajeev Kumar, learned Special Government Pleader takes notice for the first respondent and Mr.K.Karthik Jaganathan, learned Government Advocate takes notice for the second respondent. Notice to the third respondent returnable in six weeks. Private notice is also permitted.

2.Learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that one M.Dhanalakshmi, complainant, the third respondent herein made a complaint before the State Human Rights Commission, Tamil Nadu stating that while she was travelling along with her son, they were illegally detained in Nanganallur in a lodge, where they were locked in two different rooms and were brutally beaten by the petitioners, who are police officials and a false criminal case has been foisted against them in Crime No.608 of 2020 under Sections 457 and 380 of I.P.C. Learned counsel for the petitioners further submitted that when more than 20 cases are pending against the son of the complainant, on the basis of mere allegation of violation of human rights,

the above complaint was entertained by the State Human Rights Commission, ignoring the fact that the petitioners had conducted an enquiry in the manner known to law and has passed the impugned order directing the Additional Chief Secretary to Government, Home Department to pay a compensation of Rs.2,90,000/- (Rupees Two lakhs ninety thousand only) and permitting him to recover the sum of Rs.1,00,000/-, Rs.50,000/- and Rs.30,000/- from the first petitioner, respondents 2 and 3 and respondents 4 to 6 respectively as if they have violated the human rights of the complainant.

3.As some of the petitioners and other police officers said to have conducted investigation against the complainant's son against whom more than 20 criminal cases are pending, this matter needs examination. Therefore, there shall be an order of interim stay for a period of six weeks. Post the matter after six weeks.
