ORDER

This writ petition has been filed for a direction to the 1st respondent to consider the representation dated 21.11.2024 and 17.09.2025 filed by the petitioner and pass orders in the manner known to law.

2. It is averred in the writ petition that the petitioner's grandfather entered into tenancy with the 2nd respondent—Executive Officer of *Hazarath Meer Peer Sha Kadheri Dargah* on 26.04.1951, and the petitioner's family has been in enjoyment of the property since then. Towards the rental arrears payable by the petitioner's father and his brother, the 2nd respondent filed a suit for eviction. During the proceedings, a compromise was arrived with petitioner's brother and the tenancy continued. However, due to sudden demise of petitioner's father, he could not enter into a compromise with the 2nd respondent in regard to non-payment of rental arrears. Therefore, petitioner approached the 2nd respondent and, on instructions, submitted applications before the 1st respondent on 21.11.2024 and 17.09.2025. Since no orders have been passed on the said representations, the present writ petition has been filed seeking appropriate relief.

3. Mr. T. Saikrishnan, learned Standing Counsel for Wakf/1st respondent, submits that eight weeks' time may be granted to the 1st respondent to consider and pass orders on the petitioner's representations dated 21.11.2024 and



17.09.2025.

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4. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, and without expressing any opinion on the merits, this Court directs the 1st respondent to consider the petitioner's representations dated 21.11.2024 and 17.09.2025, and pass appropriate orders on merits and in accordance with law, within a period of eight weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.

5. This writ petition is disposed of with the above direction. No costs.
Consequently, connected miscellaneous petition is closed.
