Heard Mr.Silambanan, learned Senior Counsel appearing for the petitioner and Mr.Balan Haridoss, learned counsel appearing for the respondents.

The learned Senior Counsel fairly brought to my notice that, in a connected civil revision petition, the management was directed to pay the entire money. He would further contend that an application has been filed before the Hon'ble Supreme Court to review the order passed by the revision court, however, the Hon'ble Supreme Court has refused to exercise its discretion, and directed the management to approach the Division Bench.

Admittedly, there is no interim order granted by the Division Bench as on date and therefore, prima facie, I find no error committed by the executing court. The claimants are entitled to the amounts that have been arrived at and sought to be enforced, by way of execution petition.

The learned Senior Counsel would state that the management is suffering huge losses and the amount totally due to all the workmen is approximately more than Rs.2crores. He would however, fairly state that the petitioner will come up with a schedule of payment, agreeable to the claimants also.
