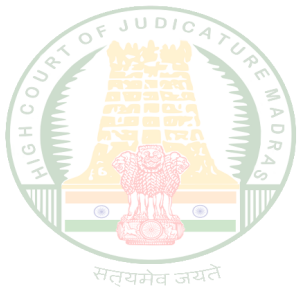

ORDER

This is a case, where, the petitioner is being referred to medical board at Chennai repeatedly from time to time. In those circumstances, the petitioner has approached this Court on an earlier occasion and this Court found fault with the action of the respondent Corporation in repeatedly referring the petitioner to the Medical Board. As the petitioner is again sought to be referred to the Medical Board at Chennai by the respondent Corporation and the petitioner is not being given an appropriate alternative employment, the petitioner has approached this Court by filing the present writ petition.

2. During the course of arguments, the learned counsel for the petitioner expressed that the petitioner is ready and willing to appear before the Medical Board. However, he is not in a position to appear before the Medical Board at Chennai, for the reason that the petitioner has to spend nearly a month at Chennai to complete the formalities.



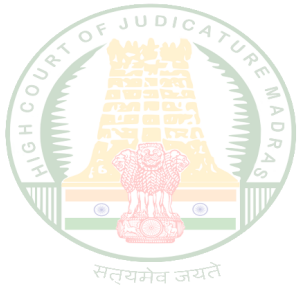

While being on loss of pay, it is very difficult for the petitioner to stay at Chennai along with his wife for a month.

3. On hearing the said submission, it was suggested that the petitioner be subjected to medical examination at Madurai once for all with a view to put a quietus to the issue.

4. In response to the same, the learned Standing Counsel for the respondent Corporation agreed that the petitioner can be referred to Medical Board at Madurai instead of sending him to Chennai.

5. In the light of the above, the respondent Corporation is directed to refer the petitioner to the Medical Board, Government Rajaji Hospital at Madurai for examination. Thereafter, depending upon the report of the Medical Board, the respondent Corporation shall act upon the same for providing alternative employment. The said exercise will be completed as expeditiously as possible at any rate within a period of three weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this Order. Meanwhile, the second respondent is also directed to permit the petitioner to join duty.

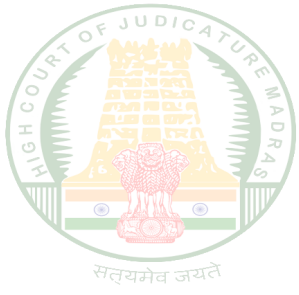
