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The Civil Miscellaneous Petition has been filed seeking orders to condone the delay of 212 days in filing the appeal against the award, dated 21.09.2022 made in M.C.O.P.No.84 of 2021 on the file of the Motor Accident Claims Tribunal/Chief Judicial Magistrate Court, Ramanathapuram.

2.Despite receipt of notice, Respondents No.2 has not turned up.

3. Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner as well as the learned counsel for the first respondent and also perused the records.

4. The learned counsel for the first respondent has vehemently, opposed to allow this petition.

5.This Court applying the principle laid down by the Hon'ble Three Judges Bench of Supreme Court in the case of **DDA vs. Tejpal** reported in **(2024) 7 SCC 433** satisfied the reasons stated in the accompanying affidavit filed in support of the condone delay petition and also in the interest of justice to give opportunity to contest the case on merits, this Court is inclined to condone the delay of 212 days.

6.Accordingly, this petition is ordered and the Registry is directed to take the appeal on file, if it is otherwise in order and list the matter in the regular course.
