2. The petitioners are apprehending their arrest in connection with Tamar P.S. Case No. 97 of 2025 registered under sections 85/108/80 of BNS, pending in the Court of learned Judicial Magistrate, Ist Class, Ranchi.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that petitioner no.1 is mother-in-law, petitioner no.2 is father-in-law and petitioner no.3 is son-in-law of petitioner nos. 1 and 2. He further submits that there are general and omnibus allegations of torture against all the accused persons. He next submits that in the F.I.R itself it has come that due to quarrel with the husband, the wife has hanged herself in the matrimonial house. On these grounds, he submits that the petitioners may kindly be provided privilege of anticipatory bail.

4. Learned counsel for the State opposes the prayer and submits that petitioner no.1 is mother-in-law, petitioner no.2 is father-in-law and petitioner no.3 is son-in-law of petitioner nos. 1 and 2.

5. Considering that petitioner no.1 is mother-in-law, petitioner no.2 is father-in-law and petitioner no.3 is son-in-law of petitioner nos. 1 and 2 and in the F.I.R itself it has come that due to some quarrel with the

husband, the wife has hanged herself in the matrimonial house.

6. In the attending facts and circumstances of the case, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners. Accordingly, the above named, petitioners are directed to surrender before the learned court within three weeks from today and in the event of their surrender / arrest, the petitioners shall be released on bail, on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 25,000/- (twenty five thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each, to the satisfaction of learned Judicial Magistrate, Ist Class, Ranchi, in connection with Tamar P.S. Case No. 97 of 2025, subject to conditions as laid down under Section 482 (2) of B.N.S.S, 2023.
