02/27.01.2026 Heard learned counsel appearing for the petitioners and learned counsel appearing for the State.

- 2. The petitioners are apprehending their arrest in connection with Amrapara P.S. Case No.12/2024, registered for the offence under Sections 341, 323, 324, 307, 120B read with 34 of the IPC, pending in the Court of the learned C.J.M., Pakur.
- 3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submits that there is land dispute between the parties. He further submits that there are general and omnibus allegations of assault against all the accused persons. He then submits that it has come in the order of the learned Sessions Judge that the injury is found to be simple. He next submits that the petitioners have got no criminal antecedent, as disclosed in paragraph 11 of this application.
- 4. Learned counsel appearing for the State opposed the prayer and submits that the allegations of assault are there against the petitioners.

5. Looking into the contents of the FIR, it transpires that there are general and omnibus allegations of assault against all the accused persons. It has come in the order of the learned Sessions Judge that the injury is said to be simple. The petitioners are having no criminal antecedent, as disclosed in paragraph 11 of this application. In the attending facts and circumstances of the case, I am inclined to extend the privilege of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

6. Accordingly, the above-named petitioners are directed to surrender before the learned Court within three weeks from today and in the event of their arrest or surrender, they shall be enlarged on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.25,000/- (Twenty Five Thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned C.J.M., Pakur in connection with Amrapara P.S. Case No.12/2024, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 482(2) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.
