the State.

2. The petitioner is apprehending his arrest in connection with
Korrah P.S. Case No. 218 of 2025, registered for the offence under Sections
64 and 351(3) of Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, pending in the court of
learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Hazaribag.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that the
petitioner has been falsely implicated in the case and the informant happens
to be major. He further submits that the false case has been lodged against
the petitioner and serious allegations are made. He next submits that now
the settlement has been made between the parties.

4. Learned A.P.P. appearing for the State has opposed the prayer
and submits that in the FIR, there are serious allegations against the
petitioner.

5. Learned counsel for the informant on instruction, submits that
the informant is present in Court and she has instructed him that she has
made settlement with the petitioner.

6. Looking to the contents of the FIR, it transpires that there are
serious allegations against the petitioner and now the girl herself, who is
major, is saying that there is settlement. Prima facie, it appears that false
case has been lodged against the petitioner that too in making such a
serious allegation against the petitioner, and in that view of the matter, the
petitioner, named above, is directed to surrender before the learned Court
within two weeks from today and the learned Court shall release the
petitioner on such terms and conditions or the sureties as the learned Court
may deem fit and proper.
