2. The petitioner is apprehending his arrest in connection with
Mirzachouki Case No. 05 of 2018, registered for the offence under
Sections 379, 182 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code, pending in the
court of learned Sub-Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Sahibganj.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that
the petitioner is the owner of the truck bearing registration number JH-
02-L-0131. She next submits that the other co-accused have already
been provided the privilege of anticipatory bail in A.B.A. No. 1456 of
2019 by the co-ordinate bench and in A.B.A. No. 459 of 2026 by this
court. She further submits that the petitioner is having no criminal
antecedent and disclosure to that effect has been made in para-17. She
also submits that it has come that the driver of the said truck has
forcibly taken away the truck from the custody of the police.

4. Learned A.P.P. appearing for the State has opposed the
prayer and submits that the allegations are there of forcibly taking
away the truck from the custody of the police.

5. Considering that the petitioner is the owner of the vehicle in question and other co-accused have already been provided the privilege of anticipatory bail in the aforementioned A.B.As. and further the petitioner is having no criminal antecedent and disclosure to that effect has been made in para-17 of the petition, in that view of the matter, the petitioner, named above, is directed to surrender before the learned Court within two weeks from today and the learned Court shall release the petitioner on such terms and conditions or the sureties as the learned Court may deem fit and proper.
