- 2. The petitioners are apprehending their arrest in connection with Jorapokhar P.S. Case No. 135 of 2025, registered for the offence under Sections 191(1), 191(2), 190, 132, 324(5), 226, 285 of Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, pending in the Court of learned Judicial Magistrate, 1st Class, Dhanbad.
- 3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submits that the allegations are made against 06 named persons and 40-50 unknown persons to block the road and altercation with police and the allegations are also made of pelting stones by the unknown persons.
- 4. Learned A.P.P. appearing for the State has opposed the prayer and submits that the petitioners were part of the unlawful assembly.
- 5. Looking to the contents of the FIR, it transpires that the allegations are made against 06 named persons and 40-50 unknown persons of altercation with police, the allegation of pelting stones on police team, is on unknown persons, in that view of the matter, the petitioners, named above, are directed to surrender before the learned Court within two weeks from today and the learned Court shall release the petitioners on such terms and conditions or the sureties as the learned Court may deem fit and proper.
