1. Heard the parties.
2. The present appeal has been filed under Section 14-A of the Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989.
3. The present appeal has been filed against the order dated 26.02.2026 passed by the learned Additional Sessions Judge-I, SC/ST Cases, Chatra in A.B.P No.306 of 2026 in connection with S.C/S.T Case No.08 of 2018, arising out of Complaint Case No.08 of 2018, for the offence under Sections 323 & 341 of the Indian Penal Code and Sections 3(1)(X)(s) of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act.
4. The prayer for anticipatory bail of the appellants were earlier rejected on merit by this Court, vide order dated 09th July, 2024 passed in Cr. Appeal (S.J) No.92 of 2024 by stating that all the allegations of the offence under the SC/ST (PoA) Act appears to be made out and further, Section 18 of the SC/ST (PoA) Act prohibits grant of anticipatory bail.
5. It is the second attempt without any reason.

6. In that view of the matter, I am not inclined to reconsider the prayer for anticipatory bail to the appellants once again. Accordingly, their prayer for anticipatory bail is hereby, rejected by following the mandate of Section 18 of SC/ST (PoA) Act.

7. Accordingly, the present criminal appeal stands dismissed.
