05/08.05.2026 Heard learned counsel appearing for the petitioners and learned counsel appearing for the State.

2. The petitioners are apprehending their arrest in connection with Bistupur P.S. Case No.113/2014, corresponding to G.R. Case No.950/2014, registered for the offence under Sections 420, 467, 468, 471 of the Indian Penal Code, pending in the Court of the learned Judicial Magistrate, 1st Class, Jamshedpur.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submits that the allegation has been made that on the forged and fabricated sale-deed, the petitioners have obtained loan from the bank. He further submits that the loan amount has already been settled. To buttress this argument, he refers to Annexure-4, which is a certificate issued by the Branch Manager, Central Bank of India, TISCO Gate Branch, Jamshedpur. On these grounds, he submits that anticipatory bail may kindly be granted to the petitioners.

4. Learned counsel appearing for the State opposed the prayer and submits that the allegations are there of obtaining loan on the forged document.

5. Annexure-4 is a certificate issued by the Branch Manager, Central Bank of India, TISCO Gate Branch, Jamshedpur, which suggests that the said loan amount has already been settled by the petitioners and in the attending facts and circumstances of the case, I am inclined to extend the privilege of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

6. Accordingly, the above-named petitioners are directed to surrender before the learned Court within three weeks from today and in the event of their arrest or surrender, they shall be enlarged on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.25,000/- (Twenty Five Thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Judicial Magistrate, 1st Class, Jamshedpur in connection with Bistupur P.S. Case No.113/2014, corresponding to G.R. Case No.950/2014, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 482(2) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.
