03/02.07.2026 Mr. Rahul Lamba, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that 1282 pieces of Medium Density Fiber Boards were being transported by the petitioner through a valid permit but in course of transit a raid was conducted by the NCB officials and 250 Kg. of Ganja was found in the vehicle which was also being transported with the Medium Density Fiber Boards of the petitioner. Mr. Lamba, has submitted that there is no seizure list with respect to the Medium Density Fiber Boards and in fact, the petitioner under a misconception had preferred an application for release of the same before the learned court below which however, was rejected on account of the fact that the goods were never produced or seized. Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that the Medium Density Fiber Boards have been kept in the Kuru Police Station and is suffering the vagaries of whether.

Learned A.C. to ASGI has submitted that she has to take instruction as to whether the NCB has any objection to release of 1282 pieces of Medium Density Fiber Boards in favour of the petitioner or not.
