for the State.

2. The petitioner is apprehending his arrest in connection with
C.C. Case No. 28 of 2026, registered for the offence under Sections
47(a) and 55 of the Excise Act, pending in the court of learned Judicial
Magistrate, 1st Class, Seraikella.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that
foreign liquor has been recovered from the house of the apprehended
co-accused Naresh Kumar Mandal. He next submits that false
allegations are made against this petitioner by the said Naresh Kumar
Mandal. He further submits that the petitioner is having three criminal
antecedents and disclosure to that effect has been made in para-11 of
the petition, however, he has already been granted bail in that matter.
He also submits that from the house, the said recovery has been made
is not belonging to the petitioner.

4. Learned A.P.P. appearing for the State has opposed the
prayer and submits that said Naresh Kumar Mandal has kept the illegal

foreign liquor in the house of this petitioner. He next submits that the petitioner is having three criminal antecedents.

5. Considering that the house is not belonging to the petitioner and having three criminal antecedents is not the sole criteria either to reject or allow the regular bail or anticipatory bail and in that view of the matter, the petitioner, named above, is directed to surrender before the learned Court within two weeks from today and the learned Court shall release the petitioner on such terms and conditions or the sureties as the learned Court may deem fit and proper.
