Heard the learned counsel for the respective sides.

In this writ application, the petitioner has prayed for a direction upon the respondent no.4 to de-freeze the saving account of the petitioner bearing Account No. 476710110003851.

At the outset, it has been submitted by the learned counsel for the petitioner that despite the petitioner having submitted representation before the respondent no.4, the same has not been acted upon.

Learned counsel appearing for the respondent no.4 has submitted that if a fresh representation is filed by the petitioner, the same shall be considered and disposed of by the respondent no.4.

Regard being had to the aforesaid submissions, this writ application stands disposed of with a liberty to the petitioner to file a fresh representation before the respondent no.4 within a period of two weeks from today and if such representation is preferred, the respondent no.4 shall look into the same and dispose it of by speaking and reasoned order, within a period of two weeks from the date of receipt/production of a copy of the said representation.
